Our *School-Parent Compact* is a written agreement between parents, students and teachers developed together. It explains what families and schools can do to help children reach grade-level standards.

An Effective compact links to learning!

⇒ **Link** goals to the school improvement plan.

⇒ **Focus** on student learning skills.

⇒ **Describe** how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction.

⇒ **Share** strategies parents can use at home.

⇒ **Explain** how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress.

⇒ **Describe** opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe and participate in the classroom.

Jointly Composed

The parents, students and staff at Anita White Carson Middle School have jointly developed a School-Parent Compact for Academic Achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added ideas to make them more specific, and students gave input on what would help them learn. A School Improvement Forum is held each year in May to review the School-Parent Compact and make changes based on needs of students.
