



High school graduation includes three components: required **course credits**, completion of a **High School and Beyond Plan**, and a **Graduation Pathway**. For each student, their path to graduation is personalized and should help them reach their future goals.

Credit Requirement

- English: 4.0
- Math: 3.0
- Science: 3.0 (2.0 must be laboratory credit)
- Social Studies: 3.0
- Career and Technical Education: 1.0
- Health: 0.5 (must include training in CPR and use of AED)
- Fitness: 1.5
- Arts: 2.0 (1.0 can be a personalized pathway requirement)
- World Language or Personalized Pathway Requirements: 2.0 (both can be PPR)
- General Electives: 4.0


Total Credits: 24.0




ABSENCES ARE THE PRIMARY CAUSE OF GRADE DECLINES IN 9TH GRADE.

Student Attendance

School attendance is one of the major factors affecting the progress made by any student. There is a direct relationship among absences, poor grades, and dropouts. Arriving on time and attending school every day are the first steps to success.

Whether excused or unexcused, the number of days your student misses can greatly impact their academic success. Strive for regular attendance. Regular attendance means having, on average, less than two absences per month. An absence is defined as missing 50% or more of their scheduled day.

- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) increases the chance that your student will not read or master math at the same level as their peers.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with schoolwork, dealing with a bully or facing some other potentially serious difficulty.
- Unexcused absences are an early warning sign for unaddressed problems with school and future dropout.




HOW TO VIEW STUDENT ATTENDANCE




Login to Parentvue

After selecting the student, select **ATTENDANCE**






IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW...


You WILL NOT get an email or text alert for tardies.

Totals By Course





Totals By Period

HOW TO VIEW GRADES







IDEAS FOR CONVERSATIONS WITH YOUR 9TH GRADER...

Statistically, there is a GIANT decrease in adult monitoring between 8th and 9th grades

Have regular, ongoing check ins with your student about school

Ask how things are going, what are they enjoying

Celebrate what is going well when also asking about areas of concern



WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I SEE MY CHILD IS STRUGGLING IN A CLASS?

- Talk to your student. You know them best ask them how you can help and what they need to be successful.
- Communicate with teachers, early and often. If something is going on, please communicate that with your student's teachers – email is the best and fastest way to reach our staff, and they should get back to you within 24 hours.
- Utilize resources for extra help

 - Office Hours with the teacher
 - Other opportunities for extra help in the works



STUDENT INVOLVEMENT AT SCHOOL





STUDENTS SELF-ADVOCATING

WHAT YOUR TEACHERS ARE READING...

PHONES

Stadium's policy is that students are to comply with the expectations set by each classroom teacher. Some teachers may allow for phones to be used for academic purposes from time to time, while others have a strict no phone policy.

Families will be contacted by the teacher, and then administration, if a student's phone or headphones are a consistent classroom distraction.

How can you help?

- Have a conversation with your student about your expectations about using their phone and headphones while in school
- Refrain from texting or calling your student throughout the school day. Before school, during their lunch, or after school are the best times to communicate.
- Monitor your student's usage of their device.







RECAP
