September: Suicide Prevention Awareness Month



September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month and our school district cares deeply about the efforts of preventing death by suicide. Because of this, we wanted to highlight for you some of the ways suicide prevention is addressed in our schools.

Suicide prevention for students begins with adult training. Our district ensures that all adults hired for any position in the district are trained on suicide prevention using materials from the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Maine by our own staff

who have undergone specific Gatekeeper training. All adults are retrained every five years.

Our district staffing reflects our community's investment in our students' mental health with access to school counselors and social workers at all levels from kindergarten through high school.

Our community has invested in MindUP and RULER curriculums, which are both SEL-ect programs endorsed by the Collaborative for Academic Social and Emotional Learning (CASEL). This means that they are aligned to CASEL's framework and include evidence-based practices for teaching social emotional topics.

In other areas of the curriculum, mental health and suicide prevention is taught explicitly, particularly in our high school Health class.

Parents of Kindergarten Students Who Ride the Bus

We will be attaching yellow bus tags, similar to what is shown here, to your students' bus tags to help drivers identify them as kindergarteners. Please do NOT take these off your child's backpacks, as they are being placed there to help drivers more easily identify them as kindergarten students. Although drivers do



get to know their students well, from time to time there are substitute drivers and we want to make every effort to be sure your child is known.

Why is this important? Per the K-2 Parent Handbook, an adult must meet kindergarten students at their bus stop. If an adult is not visibly present at the bus stop, the driver will return the student to school and the school will contact the parents. Parents may permit an older sibling or neighbor to accept a child from the bus, but must make this arrangement in writing with the bus driver or bus department before it can occur.


