At the high school level, students can do everything from graduating early by dual enrolling in our virtual program and our comprehensive high school to attending an early college program where students can earn their associate's degree at the same time they earn their high school diploma from St. Helens High School. The world has changed, and how we meet the needs of today's learners in the St. Helens School District has changed with them.

- High School Early College: The program offers students a unique opportunity to earn college credits at PCC while completing their high school education at St. Helens High School, setting them on a path to success in higher education. In partnership with the Portland Community College and the Beaverton School District, students can immerse themselves full-time in a college experience at either PCC Rock Creek or Sylvania campuses, with staff and offices available at both locations. offers а comprehensive two-year engagement approximately six terms. Typically, students apply during the spring of their 10th grade or the fall of their 11th grade. They complete all high school credit requirements at PCC while simultaneously earning college credits for all their courses. On average, graduates accumulate around 75-80 transferable college credits upon completion. The program operates full-time, involving 12-16 credits per term, equivalent to a standard college load. Upon graduation, approximately 40% of students achieve an Associate of Arts (AA) degree, further solidifying their higher education foundation.
- **Plymouth High School:** Offering a flexible and personalized learning experience for students, ensuring that each individual can reach their full potential. Plymouth High School generally has smaller class sizes and does not have the distractions that accompany a large, comprehensive high school. Students often attend Plymouth High School who enjoy a quieter setting without all of the pomp and circumstance.
- St. Helens Virtual Academy: Delivering a comprehensive and adaptable online learning environment that meets the diverse needs of our students and families. Our Virtual Academy accommodates students from kindergarten through 12th grade. The St. Helens School District provides the chance for students to engage with suitable educational material for each grade level from the comfort of their own homes or other off-site locations through virtual learning. In addition, weekly inperson support is available, as well as field trips and other in-person activities throughout the year to enhance the educational experience.

- St. Helens High School and Virtual Hybrid: Students can concurrently enroll at St. Helens High School and the Virtual Academy. Students have the flexibility to engage with both their ongoing class subjects and materials at St. Helens High School, as well as catch up on previous class subjects and/or materials within the Virtual Academy. Doing so allows students to accelerate their graduation and take classes to free up space in their schedule for more focused studies or make up credits.
- St. Helens Homeschool Connections: Our Homeschool Connections program is different from our Virtual Academy in that it allows families to choose their own curriculum and monitor their child's progress. Students in this program have access to tutors, resources, and funds to be successful, yet require a parent or other adult to support instruction from home.

We have so much to be proud of at the St. Helens School District and even more to look forward to, given the options we are able to provide families. We are excited to offer opportunities for success beyond the traditional school house. As we embark on this new school year together and look forward to the many achievements and milestones our students will accomplish, we want to thank our community for their continued support and partnership. We strive to provide the best educational experience tailored for each and every child in the St. Helens community.
