What is Title I?

Kendrick Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act 2015 (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental engagement. Kendrick Middle school jointly develop with parents and staff a written parent and family engagement plan. Several meetings were held to gain input.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Kendrick Middle will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Kendrick Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. How is it revised?

Kendrick Middle School invited all parents April and September to attend our Annual Parent & Family Engagement Policy Input meetings to review and revise this parent and family engagement plan, as well as the school wide plan, school-parent compact and parent engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through our online form. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan Kendrick Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, parents of students in transition, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will send the final copy home with students to all parents in October. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center room 712. A copy is available on the school website and a copy will be available in the front office

2024-2025 District Goals

Clayton County Public Schools will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient and/or Distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones by at least 8% in each content area.

2024-2025 Kendrick Middle School

Goals All students will show a 8% or more increase in Reading, Mathematics, Social Studies and Science proficiency on the Georgia Milestones by May 2024.

We will meet this goal by:

Math - Embed additional math instruction in the exploratory schedule. Utilize Title paraprofessional in conjunction to work directly with low performing students to reinforce basic math skills.

ELA – Incorporate usage of instructional technology into specials rotation to supplement ELA/Reading instruction.

Social Studies – Utilizing Inquiry based instruction to develop student’s ability to demonstrate learned information.

Science – Utilizing Argument Driven Inquiry to develop critical thinking & an investigative mindset.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Kendrick Middle School and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students and teachers during the School Forum. The school-parent compact was distributed to all parents through each child’s teacher if parents need a copy it can be found on the school website.

Kendrick Middle School will take the following measures to promote and support parents as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will

- ❖ The school administrators are responsible for reporting the results of the annual school review (College & Career Readiness Performance Index CCRPI) status to parents at the beginning of the school year. Information will be posted on the school website, presented at the school's first PTSA meeting, and in Parent Resource Center. → Parents will receive a copy of their child's assessment results whenever a national, state or district level assessment is given. A parent report guide is provided with the national and state assessments so parents can understand the meaning of the results. Every effort is made to provide parents with conference time to share the results and answer questions.
- ❖ Assessments used to measure student's progress and proficiency levels in which students are expected to meet will be explained at Curriculum Night and reviewed during parent/teacher conferences. An explanation of the Georgia Milestones will be provided to parents along with the state's Common Core Performance Standards throughout the school year.
- ❖ The school will handle responses to parent questions, concerns and suggestions in a timely manner via telephone calls, notes, emails and conferences. Translators will be provided as needed.
- ❖ Through parent meetings/workshops the school will provide information for parents to assist their understanding of the National Education Goals and the Common Core State Standards.
- ❖ Throughout the school year the school will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve student achievement such as literacy and math training for parents, if necessary, and using technology to foster parental involvement.
