*<u>Field Training (FT):</u> Cadets compete nationally to attend FT between their sophomore and junior year. FT is a 2.5-week summer encampment at Maxwell AFB, AL. Cadets are evaluated on their leadership potential. By completing FT, cadets join the Professional Officer Course.



What is Leadership Lab (LLAB)?

A 2-hour class held once per week. Cadets wear military uniforms or business casual attire and practice leadership skills, drill and ceremonies, and teamwork.

What is Physical Training (PT)?

Group workouts held twice per week to improve physical fitness. Workouts focus on cardio and calisthenics to prepare for the Air Force Fitness Test.

Does joining AFROTC require a military service obligation?

No, cadets do not incur a service obligation by joining AFROTC. For most freshmen and sophomores, remaining within the program is optional. Cadets "contract" at the beginning of their junior year or when activating a scholarship; once contracted, cadets may then incur a service obligation.

High School Scholarship Program (HSSP):

Application Dates:

HSSP Type 1:

- FULL Tuition and authorized fees at any public or private institution
 - On-Campus Housing: Cadets may convert tuition scholarship for up to \$10,000 in housing expenses
- \$300-\$500 monthly stipend
- \$900 textbook allowance per year
- Initial travel expenses to university paid

Basic Requirements:

- ✓ Be a U.S. citizen by scholarship activation
- ✓ Be at least 17 years old by scholarship activation
- ✓ No previous full-time college experience Minimum Academic Requirements:
- ☐ GPA: 3.0 unweighted by end of junior yr
- ☐ SAT: 1240 **OR** ACT: 26**

**Note: super scoring of SAT/ACT not permitted

In-College Scholarship Program (ICSP):

Overview: There is no formal application for ICSP. ICSP is awarded by a national board and/or by detachment staff based on cadets' leadership & overall performance in the ROTC program.

Type 1: **FULL** college tuition at any public or private institution

Type 2: Up to \$18,000 per year in tuition at any public or private institution

Both Type 1 & Type 2 include monthly stipends of \$300-\$500, plus a \$900 book allowance per year

Brig. Gen. McGee Leadership Award:

 \$18,000 tuition or \$10,000 housing assistance per year to any Cadet not already on scholarship who has completed field training & entered POC by start of junior year.

Det 001-specific Programs:

- In-state room rate if living in UAA dorms
- Aviation opportunities
