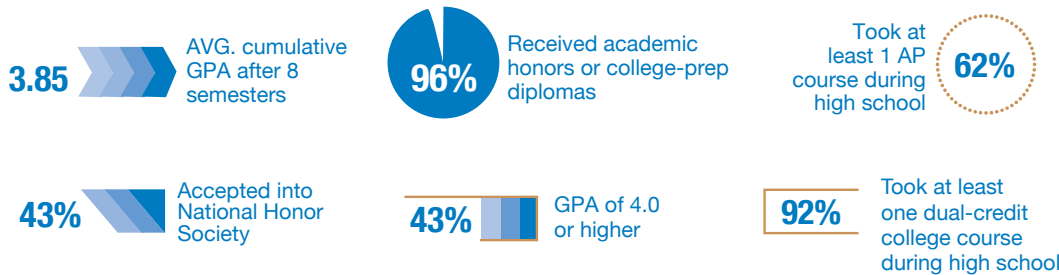

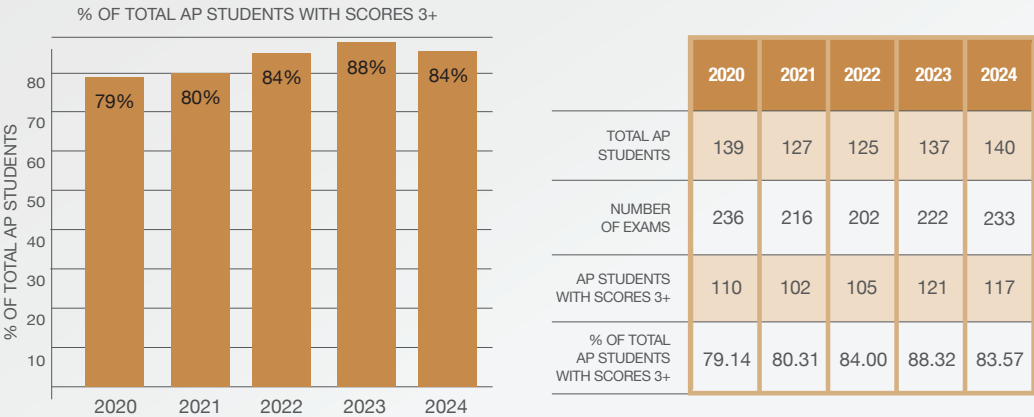

**Weighted Grades:** Heritage uses a weighted grade system. All AP, Honors, and dual credit college courses will be weighted. Each semester, after the cumulative GPA is calculated, the following point values will be added to determine the official weighted GPA: all AP and dual credit courses will receive a point value of .025 per semester, and all Honors courses will receive a point value of .0125 per semester.
