

What is EFMP?

EFMP is a mandatory enrollment program for all active duty service members who have a family member with special needs. EFMP works with other military and civilian agencies to provide comprehensive and coordinated community support, housing, medical, educational and personnel services to families with special needs.

What is an EFM?

An Exceptional Family Member (EFM) is a child or adult with any physical, emotional, developmental or intellectual disorder who requires special treatment, therapy, education, training or counseling. For detailed information on the criteria for identifying a family member with special needs, please refer to AFI 40-701 Special Needs Identification and Assignment Coordination (SNIAC) & DoDI 1315.19

Roles & Responsibilities

EFMP-FS Coordinator

Inform and educate the base populace about EFMP, emphasizing community support. Connects Airmen and family members with support services for special needs, advocacy assistance and helps provide a continuum of care to facilitate a seamless transition from installation to installation. Works in partnership with all involved providing Exceptional Service to Exceptional Families.

EFMP-M (Medical)

Enroll Airmen and register family members in the active EFMP database. Train and outreach to support EFMP requirements within the Medical Treatment Facility, with a emphasis on identification of special needs during routine medical care. Screens family members for OCONUS/CONUS travel, checking for service availability at projected location. [Located in Wilford Hall Medical Center, (210)292-2775/5864/4721]

EFMP-A (Assignments)

Considers the medical and educational needs of the Exceptional Family Member (EFM) during the assignment process. Assigns Airmen to an area where EFM's medical and educational needs can be accommodated provided there is a valid personnel requirement for the Airmen's grade and AFSC. [Located in bldg 5616, (210)671-9155]
