The district consists of 8 elementary, 3 middle, and 2 high schools which accommodate approximately 11,000 students. Samuel V. Champion High School was opened in 2008 as a public four-year secondary school and is accredited by the Texas Education Agency. CHS completes in District 26-5A and has an approximate enrollment of 2,000 students in grades 9-12.

CLASS RANKING

Boerne ISD is a non-ranking school district. Students are given a numerical ranking only when they are notified if they qualify for automatic admission to a Texas public university or college. Class grade averages are calculated at the end of each semester. BISD assigns weights to semester grades earned in eligible courses and calculates a weighted numerical grade average, in accordance with the following:

Advanced Courses=Multiplied by 1.10n-Level Courses=Multiplied by 1.0

Adjusted grades are used in computing GPA and class *rank*, *but* numerical grades on the transcript do not reflect added points. GPA is calculated on a 100% scale and provided as a weighted average only.

GRADING All grades are recorded numerically. Transfer grades are recorded using the numerical equivalent on the grade scale of the sending school.

Otherwise, grades are translated as follows: A 90-100 B 80-90 C 70-79 F Below 70
