

VOLLEYBALL WIN OVER TCA HIGHLIGHTS

"Serving was the name of the game in this one."

With those words, Coach Andrew Laman summarized the best trait of his Crockett County volleyball team Tuesday night as the Lady Cavaliers swept past visiting Trinity Christian Academy 25-22, 25-21, and 25-12 for a 3-0 triumph. The win, moving Laman's club to 11-2 on the season, highlighted a full day of sports in Cav Land.

VOLLEYBALL: "We made very few service errors tonight, and that was the key to the victory," the first-year head coach said. "We gave away some points otherwise, and took a while to settle in, but everything looked good by the third set.

Crockett received its usual strong play from a deep lineup of hitters, including Dee Cole, Katherine West, Keeton Holyfield, Jordyn Maddox, Madi Collins, and Kylee Garrett, but TCA – which always fields a competitive squad that works hard on every point – kept the first two sets in doubt until the end. By the third set, the Lady Cavs were finding the open spots on the floor with better efficiency.

Crockett will play at powerful Lexington Thursday in its next outing before heading for Mississippi Saturday to play in the Oxford Invitational Tournament.

CROSS-COUNTRY: Both the girls and boys teams of Coach Julie Nass placed eighth at the Huntingdon Invitational meet Tuesday at the Huntingdon Soccer Complex. Twenty-two schools fielded entries in the girls 5K, while 25 schools had racers in the boys event.

For the second straight race, Claire Evans and Avery Thornton earned medals for Top 20 performances in the girls event, just squeezing in under the wire for 19th and 20th place, respectively. Lane Foster just missed a medal in the boys race, finishing 21st to head the Crockett contingent.

GOLF: For the first time this season in a non-tournament format, Crockett's boys fell by a sizeable margin to a host team. Chester County, a school with a fairly rich golf tradition in West Tennessee, easily defeated the Cavs 165-185 at Chickasaw Golf Course near Henderson.

While Crockett's Jack Shaver carded the day's second-best nine-hole score with a 40, Chester County bunched rounds of 35, 42, 44, and 44 to create the winning margin. George Randall was next-best for the Cavs with a 46, while Clay Kail posted a 49 and Max Woods a 50.

The girls match was much closer, but Chester County's two-player squad edged Crockett 107-109, although the Lady Cavs' Rachel Crossnoe had the contest's best round with a 49. Addalynn Dunn shot 60 for Crockett.

The teams will face JCS Thursday at Humboldt Golf & Country Club.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SOFTBALL: Reagen McCoy pitched a run-rule no-hitter and drove in two runs herself to pace CCMS to a 10-0 shutout of Gibson County, pushing the Lady Cavs' record to 8-4.

Jentry Maddox stroked a two-run single in the first inning, added a sacrifice fly in a four-run third frame, and singled home two runs again in the fourth to finish with a game-high five RBIs. Emilee Chandler went 3-for-3, including a triple, and scored three runs for the winners. Marissa Hazelwood joined McCoy with two hits and two RBIs. Naudia Turner and Ariana Mosier tallied twice apiece for Crockett and Ruthie Tucker also drove in a run.

McCoy struck out five and walked two in keeping Gibson County off the scoreboard.

MIDDLE SCHOOL FOOTBALL: After opening the season with four straight wins, CCMS dropped from the ranks of the undefeated Tuesday when it fell to visiting South Gibson. Crockett was plagued by penalties and fumbles in the early going, and the Hornets took full advantage.

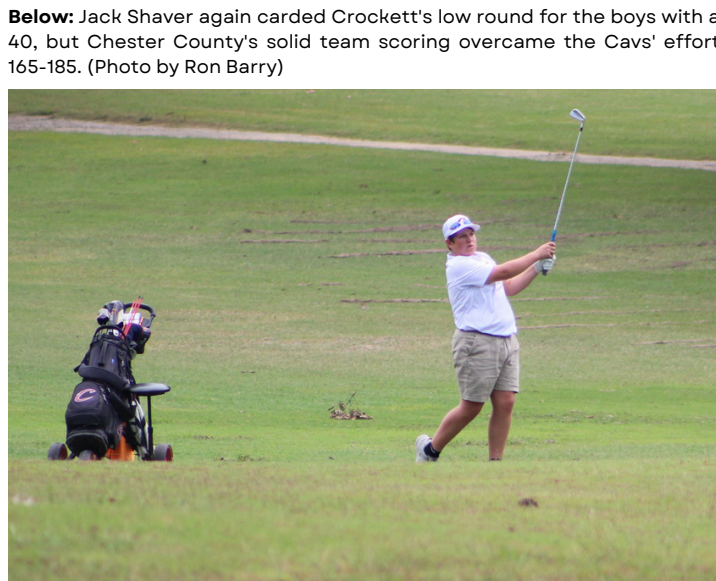
