School

El Camino High School at Ventura College (ECHS) is a small alternative **public middle college high school** situated on the grounds of Ventura College.

- Each semester students are required to dually enroll in Ventura County Community College District courses for advanced study and development of **career, technical and collegiate pathways** while completing high school graduation requirements.
- Students in grades 9-12 concurrently complete an **individualized** four-year high school curriculum in an independent study format that is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.
- Our high school program is **competency-based**, meaning all courses and tests must be passed with scores at 70% or better. College preparatory and select honors and Advanced Placement courses meet the a-g requirements for admission to the University of California or California State University.
- ECHS students have the option of participating in **competitive sports** and career **technical education courses** through programs within Ventura Unified School District.

Students request enrollment at ECHS through the Ventura Unified School District Alternate Placement Committee. Criteria for acceptance into the program include gradelevel reading and math skills as well as other academic and personal factors.

At El Camino High School at Ventura College, we provide students with a supportive and caring academic environment, rich in opportunity, choice, accountability, and challenge. We believe each student is entitled to a learning environment and delivery system that best suits their academic abilities, personal needs, and goals.

honor the unique qualities and diverse background of all students,








VUSD Dual Enrollment

All VUSD students at all grade levels are permitted to enroll in college classes via the California Community College system. Courses can be taken to fulfill graduation requirements, get a jump start on college degree requirements or explore personal interests. Courses that are transferable to the University of California system are weighted on a 5.0 scale. Beginning in the 2020-21 school year, college classes were added to a student's listed ECHS courses to



enable the California Dashboard to identify students as "prepared" on the "College and Career Indicator" (CCI). Summer courses continue to be listed on the ECHS transcript under the institution where the coursework was completed.

Curriculum

El Camino utilizes an independent study delivery system for high school core classes delivered on our campus. Flexible learning arrangements allow students to pursue their academic and career goals and outside responsibilities while staying on track for graduation. This includes creating four-year learning plans individualized according to students' post-secondary objectives such as completing requirements for career-technical training, UC-CSU college entrance, university STEM prerequisites, or Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC-see page 4).

El Camino High School enjoys a special partnership with Ventura County Community College District as a **Middle College High School.** This offers our students an earlier course registration date than students at comprehensive high schools. All ECHS students are required to take at least one community college class each semester which enables them to:

- Earn community college credits that can also be applied to high school graduation requirements
- Obtain dynamic classroom instruction and enhance academic standing via rigorous advanced level coursework
- Participate in performance and visual arts as well as state-of-the-art Career Technical Education
- Work toward completion of the requirements for an associate degree or certificate program or completion of undergraduate requirements to enable transfer to a four-year university




ECHS does not rank students. Latin honors are used to recognize and distinguish high academic performance.

ECHS & Ventura College Credits

ECHS' and VCCCD's calendars are on a semester system. At El Camino, students earn five credits per course each semester. Completion of year-long courses earns ten high school credits.

For community college courses, a semester three- to five-unit course is equivalent to ten high school credits. College courses awarding less than three units earn five high school credits.

<u>GPA</u> is calculated on a 4.0 scale. Weighted GPA is on a 5.0 scale. AP courses and Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) are weighted on a 5.0 scale. (See page 4 for IGETC courses available to our students at Ventura College.)

Postsecondary Skills Development

ECHS students participate in career exploration and 21st-century skills development via specialty classes and clubs:

El Camino students pursue multiple **Ventura County Community College Career Education** pathways such as Automotive, Applied Manufacturing, Business, Child Development, Criminal Justice, Dental Hygiene, Fire Science, and Welding programs. Each semester our Juniors and Seniors are invited to enroll in career mentorships via Ventura County Office of Education's **Career Education Center** and the Naval Surface Warfare Center, Port Hueneme Division's **Pre-Engineering Program**.
