- (2) Must become a Certified School Bus Inspector in accordance with FAC rule GA-3.0171
 - (a) New hire required to be qualified within 6 months.
 - (b) Current BCSD employee to be qualified within 3 months
- (3) Possess a valid Florida CDL Class B license with air brakes, passenger and school bus endorsements.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

Considerable knowledge of construction, assembly and adjustment and maintenance of a wide variety of automobiles, buses, trucks and of shop tools. Ability to diagnose the more common defects of motors and of all types of shop equipment. Ability to detect, by inspection, any work or broken part, or wrongly adjusted part of assembly. Ability to keep records of repair and service operations, and to make reports. Ability to follow oral and written instructions accurately. Employees of this class perform skilled tasks in mechanical repair and maintenance of automobile, heavy duty trucks, tractors, buses, and other standard, special automotive equipment in accordance with standard trade practices. Ability to use a variety of equipment; such as, hydraulic lifts, welder, tire changer, engine analyzer, power tools and hand tools. Work may include welding, occasional machining of parts or other duties relating to the upkeep of equipment. Supervisor may check work during repair, or test running condition of equipment after work is completed. Knowledge of State and national standards for school buses.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1) Inspect and make repairs on all aspects of School Board automotive vehicles and equipment.
- 2) Do general and major repair work on automobiles, buses, light and heavy trucks, graders, mowers, and other automotive, diesel, and mechanical equipment.
- 3) Inspect, adjust and replace necessary units and related parts, including cooling, fuel and exhaust systems.
- 4) Tune motors using standard testing equipment.
- 5) Repair and overhaul brakes, transmissions, differentials, front and rear axle assemblies and repair and install hydraulic controls.
- 6) Perform all different phases of tire work.
- 7) Perform emergency road repairs and test-drive buses and other vehicles to ensure they are in safe operating condition.
- 8) Maintain tools and equipment in good working order.
- 9) Assist the Shop Foreman in scheduling the progression of vehicles through the shop.

- 10) Take the lead role in the absence of the Shop Foreman.
