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## School Profile 2024-25

The Miller Place School District is located on the north shore of Suffolk County, approximately 65 miles east of Manhattan. The district includes all of Miller Place and part of the community of Sound Beach. The area encompassed by the district is six and two-thirds square miles, with a population of approximately 14,000. The community is primarily residential. The educational programs and services offered at Miller Place reflect a quest for scholastic excellence, combined with a genuine respect and concern for the worth and development of the individual students. The curriculum is aligned with New York Standards and provides numerous educational opportunities through enrichment programs and BOCES placement. In addition to its strong academic traditions and offerings, Miller Place offers an after school program of clubs and sports at the secondary level.

## Courses and Grading System

**Honors courses:** English 9H, English 10H; Social Studies 9H; Geometry H; Algebra 2 H; Pre-calculus H; Living Environment H; Chemistry H; Spanish IVH and VH; Italian IVH and VH

**College Courses:** College Forensics; College Accounting, College Business Law, Virtual Enterprise, Robotics Engineering Design, Scientific Computing, Spanish/French/Italian III, IV and V, Future Medical Professionals, Environmental Science

**Advanced Placement:** English Language & Composition; English Literature & Composition; United States History; World History; Government & Politics; Calculus AB/BC; Statistics; Biology; Chemistry; Physics; Studio Art (2-D & Drawing); Psychology; Capstone Seminar; Capstone Research. Please note: not all Advanced Placement courses are offered every school year. Offerings are based on enrollment.

## Grading System

Final grades for all subjects are used in computing the cumulative grade point average at the end of grade 11. Grades in all Honors, Advanced Placement, and College level courses will be given a 5 percent weighting increment when the grade point average is calculated. **Please note: course averages printed on an official transcript are unweighted. Weighting is calculated into the cumulative grade point average. Students are not assigned a numeric rank in class.** A conversion scale for our numeric grades to letter grades is as follows: 90-100 = A; 80-89 = B; 70-79 = C; 65-69 = D; <64 = F
