CNM Lab Helps CCHS Students Get Back on Track

For the third consecutive year CCHS has built in a CNM lab into our schedule to assist students who are struggling at CNM, as well as those who are new to CCHS that are taking college classes for the first time.

The lab is ran by our Dean of Students, Veronica Andrade. She reinforces good academic habits, teaches the students how to navigate CNM's online platform, helps them prioritize assignments, and checks on their grades weekly.

"The most fulfilling part is seeing the students gain confidence as they improve their skills. Watching them go from struggling to feeling capable and prepared for their classes brings me a lot of joy," explained Mrs. Andrade.

If a student has a rough semester at CNM they are placed in the lab to get extra assistance. One of those students was Yuletzzy Valenzuela, who will graduate this spring from CCHS and has already finished multiple degrees at CNM

"Ms. Andrade was always there for me. We had really good conversations in the lab. When I needed

Due to her hard work and applying the lessons she has learned at CCHS, Valenzuela has already earned a Certificate of Spanish language, Associate Degree of Applied Science in Integrated Studies, Certificate in General Studies, and American Heart Association Basic Life Support at CNM.

"Being in the CNM lab taught me how to talk to adults more confidently and use my time more effectively," Valenzuela said

This year all new 10th-12th graders were placed in the lab as we recognized a need to give more support to new CCHS students who are transitioning into a dual credit high school.
