

DUAL ENROLLMENT



Enrollment in both the Fall and Spring during designated timeframes established by FLCC.

Registration is a 3 step process:

1. Student logs online to FLCC website and selects courses they'd like to receive college credit for.
2. Student fills out a "Certificate of Residency" form to verify address, and a payment form.

Both CofR and payment are during FLCC representative visits at the High School in both the Fall and Spring. Dates are TBD and will be communicated by the Counseling Department.



Register in the fall on the MCC website. Payment due from families at time of enrollment. Can pay online.

Students will be invited to apply for college credit AFTER the course ends. RIT mails home information to ONLY the students that qualify for credit.

Courses cost \$225. The District does not cover the cost.

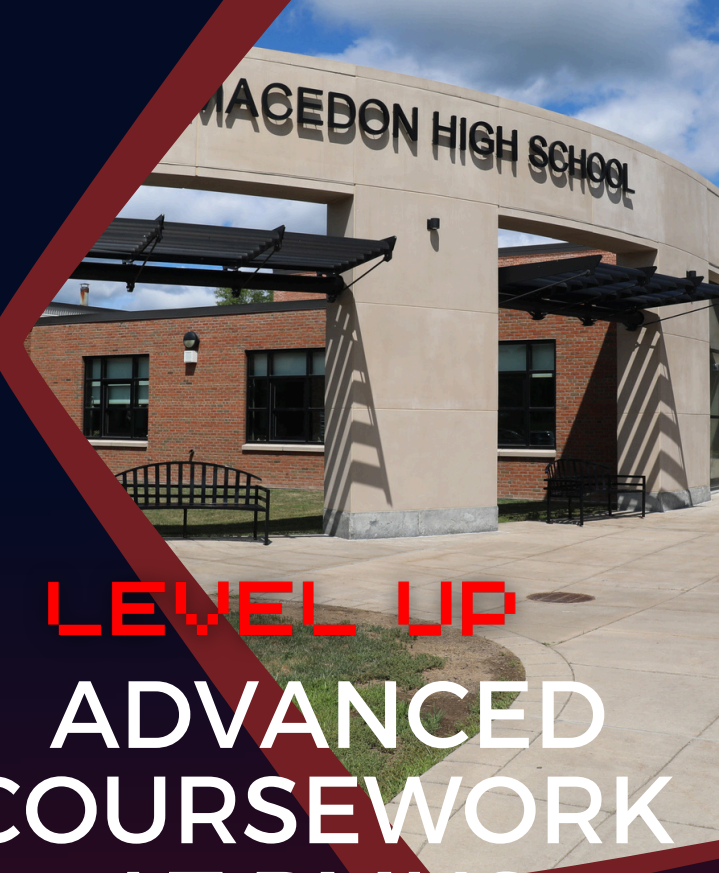

ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

Advanced Placement (AP)

These college-level courses include World History, Calculus, US History and Music Theory (every other year). At the end of the course, students can take the AP exam, and if they score well, they might earn college credit.

AP exams are paid by the District.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

These courses offer a comprehensive and globally recognized curriculum with an emphasis on critical thinking, international awareness, and interdisciplinary learning.

IB exams are paid by the District.

Dual Enrollment/College Credit

These courses allow high school students to take college classes and earn college credit while still in high school. They are often offered in partnership with:

- Finger Lakes Community College
- Monroe Community College
- Rochester Institute of Technology
- SUNY Oneonta

Project Lead the Way (PLTW)

The PLTW Engineering pathway is a curriculum designed for high school students interested in exploring the field of engineering and related disciplines.

This program aims to engage students with hands-on, project-based learning that develops critical thinking, problem-solving, collaboration, and communication skills.
