Petitions/Communications

There were three Freedom of Information Act requests. The first was from SmartProcure, which sought all purchasing information from May 15, 2024 to the present. The second was from a reporter from the Metro East Sun who sought information regarding all staff names, school name where he or she works, job title, and salary. The third was also from the Metro East Sun who sought information for all new and retiring staff this school year. All three requests were filled within the five-day timeframe.

Public Participation

The Board welcomed the public to the meeting.

Representatives from the Freeburg Elementary Teachers' Association addressed the Board regarding the actions of Board Member Baker. A report from an impartial investigator found Mr. Baker created an uncomfortable working environment. The Teachers' Association called on the Board to take action in light of this.

John Lawson from the local VFW addressed the Board regarding the Patriot's Pen essay contest and Teacher of the Year nominations.

A citizen addressed the Board regarding a student issue.

Superintendent's Report

The district has prioritized the safety and wellbeing of students and staff by conducting comprehensive crisis training during the first two days of school, led by the Freeburg Fire and Police Departments. Training included Stop the Bleed, fire alarm protocols, and the 4 E's model (educate, evade, escape, and engage) for effective crisis management. Students also participated in fire and bus evacuation drills, with a lockdown intruder drill scheduled for September 5th.

The district acknowledges the support of local community leaders and businesses, including help with school signage. An annual meeting with high school administrators and first responders to review crisis and reunification plans is scheduled for next week.

Upcoming events include a Back to School Picnic on August 29th and a Social Media Awareness Community Event on September 24th, featuring discussions on cyberbullying, online harassment, and mental health awareness, with notable guest speakers in attendance.

Dr. Brink gave an enrollment update to the Board. Currently, there are 739 students enrolled. This is down from 783 last year.

Dr. Brink reviewed the bullying policy with the Board. The policy can be found in the addenda. This policy is in the board policy manual and will be distributed to students and parents in the student handbook.

Mr. Scheibel gave an update from the Illinois Association of School Boards. There are legislative events scheduled for this fall. More information is forthcoming on those.

Mr. Janssen gave an update on the progress of the summer projects. The exterior door replacement is completed. Both buildings were ready for the start of school. Mr. Janssen thanked the Maintenance and Custodial staff for their hard work over the summer.

Principal Tiffany Zurliene presented the Elementary School Principal's Report.

- Open House was a great evening and we had a great turn out. We would like to give a shout out to Madelyn Benner and her team for creating the balloon arches at the Elementary and Primary Center.
- August 15, 16, and 19th. Each grade level went through bootcamp which is a refresh on how to be respectful, responsible and ready at Freeburg Elementary. Stations included the office, cafeteria, main entrance, technology, nurse, and bus evacuation.
- Our SRO officer Scott presented to each grade level on August 21st. Scott educated students on safety, respect and standing-up against bullying.
- We had our first fire drill on Thursday, August 22nd. Thanks to Hans and the fire department for assisting with the drill.

Director of Student Services Amanda Hargan presented her report.

The 24-25 school year has had an extremely impressive start. Staff are working so hard to meet student individual needs while adhering to schedule expectations and limitations, prescribed minutes and various factors that can be incredibly complicated. Staff have worked many hours off the clock, in the summer and on weekends, to put together an organized plan always focusing on doing what is best for kids. Staff have been working together and joining forces all for the sake of student excellence.

Special Education

Currently Freeburg 70 serves 85 students with IEPs between the primary center and the elementary buildings; 14 students are served in specialized programs outside of their home school; and there are 40 speech only IEPs for a total of approximately 139 IEPs from early childhood to 8th grade. Needs are quite varied across the board and teachers, aides and related service staff are continuously seeking improved methods for success across the board academically, behaviorally and emotionally. Currently Freeburg's special education population is 18% which is above the state average of 15%(2023). The special education team will meet monthly to review student needs, data and educational programming, setting goals for overall student growth academically and behaviorally.

504

Currently Freeburg 70 serves 28 students with 504 plans for a percentage of 4%. These needs are varied as well. Meetings are held annually. We are working to clarify accommodations to ensure they are effective and manageable.

Response to Intervention / MTSS (Multi-tiered Systems of Support)

Fall benchmark screenings are wrapping up at both the primary center and the elementary school. Data teams will be meeting this week and next along with grade level teachers to review data, assess needs within the different grade levels and plan for intervention strategies related to reading and math. Ongoing discussion related to writing, social emotional and behavioral needs are taking place. Student support (WIN-What I Need) team meetings will also begin soon to help support students and teachers achieve academic and behavioral goals.
