## THE SCHOOL

An International Baccalaureate World School, Carrollwood Day School (CDS) was founded in 1982 and currently serves students from age two through 12th grade. In May 2009, the school graduated its first senior class. CDS is recognized nationally for its academic excellence and its innovative school-wide emphasis on character development. The curriculum for Carrollwood Day School follows guidelines established by the International Baccalaureate Organization. **CDS is one of only 36 schools in the United States authorized to offer the full curriculum / continuum of IB programmes from early childhood through college preparatory.** In 2020, CDS was inducted into the Cum Laude Society, the highest academic honor society a secondary school can earn in the U.S. In 2021, construction was completed on the new Center for Innovation, bringing an additional 40,600 square feet to accommodate a new student union, entrepreneurial center dedicated to innovation, new science wing with state-of-the-art labs, as well as design technology and visual arts classrooms. As part of the addition, the Dr. Shalin and Neha Patel College Counseling Center opened in 2021, a dynamic space for student support. In 2022, CDS was selected as a Round Square member, an international network of 250 schools committed to international exchange and experiential learning. The school emphasizes performance, collaboration, and moral character, believing in the importance of building an ethical learning community to define its students as the future leaders of a global society.

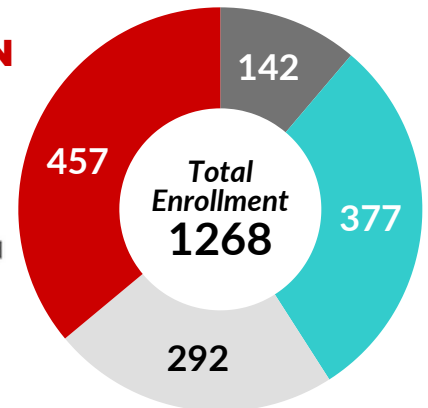

## CLUBS & EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

**Lower School:** ECC students can participate in after school Culinary Arts, Intramurals, and Soccer. Elementary students can generally choose from a variety of after school programs including Art, Chess, Lego STEM Club, Makers Club, Music Lessons, and Sports/Fitness Clubs.

**Middle School:** Middle School students can participate in a wide choice of clubs, including: Art Honor Society, EBIT, eSports, Forensics, French Honor Society, Jr. Thespians Troupe, Math Society, Model UN, National Junior Beta, Patriot Leader Society, Robotics, Spanish Honor Society, STEM Society, Student Council, and Tri-M Music Honor Society.

**Upper School:** Upper School students can participate in three governing bodies: Student Council, Student Advisory Board, and Student Athletic Leadership Council. In addition to 21 general clubs, the Upper School also offers 15 "Breaking Ground" clubs that are 100% initiated and led by students. Clubs represent a wide range of interests including these: American Sign Language, Art Appreciation, CDS Ambassadors, Chess Club, Club La Conexión (Spanish), Dance Club, DECA, French Honor Society, Girls Weightlifting, History Club, HOSA, Indian Culture Club, Key Club, Model UN, National Beta Club, Robotics Club, Speech & Debate, STEM Society, Thespians Troupe, and Yearbook Club.

# CURRICULUM AND GRADUATION STANDARDS

## GRADING SCALE

All IB Middle Years Programme (MYP) Honors courses are weighted 0.5.

All IB Diploma Programme (DP) Standard Level (SL) courses are analogous to the AP level with a minimum of 150 contact hours and are weighted 1.0.

All IB Diploma Programme (DP) Higher Level (HL) courses require 240 contact hours per class, which is more classroom time than a traditional AP course, and are weighted 1.0.

### Minimum Graduation Requirements

A minimum of 24 credits is required for graduation, including the following:

## INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAMME

Carrollwood Day School is honored to partner with the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO). **CDS is the only school on the west coast of Florida to offer the full five-year Middle Years Programme (MYP) curriculum.** CDS has been an IB World School since 2005 and was the sixth school in the United States fully authorized to offer the continuum of Primary Years Programme (PYP) - Middle Years Programme (MYP) - Diploma Programme (DP) curricula, and the first IB World School in Florida to achieve this distinction.

### Primary Years Programme (PYP)

IB at CDS begins with the PYP in the Lower School with students in preschool through grade 5. The PYP emphasizes the interrelatedness of knowledge, concepts, and skills through a transdisciplinary program of six units of inquiry providing a strong foundation for the rigor of the MYP and DP programmes in grades 6 through 12. PYP includes the study of a secondary language as well as an exhibition for all 5th grade students to showcase their growth throughout the program.

### Middle Years Programme (MYP)

The MYP helps students develop learning attitudes and skills that will enable them to participate actively and responsibly in society. Learning how to evaluate information critically is as important as learning facts. The students' experiences with the MYP culminates in their sophomore year with a yearlong personal project where students choose and explore a topic of their choice that showcases their unique interests and talents.

### Diploma Programme (DP)

The IB Diploma Programme is a rigorous pre-university course of studies that meets the needs of highly motivated secondary school students. Unlike most IB schools, at CDS the IB Diploma Programme is designed to be inclusive so a student can register as a full IB Diploma Candidate, an IB Course Candidate, or a CDS graduate based on his or her individual needs for academic rigor. Approximately 70% graduate as full IB students and 100% of students in 11th and 12th grade enroll in at least one IB course.

## REQUIREMENTS OF THE IB CURRICULUM

### Middle Years Programme:

- Maximum of eight courses (up to six core) per semester
- At least 25 hours of community service per year
- Completion of the Personal Project consisting of a process journal, a final product, and a personal statement
- The study of at least two languages (language of instruction and additional language of choice)

### Diploma Programme:

- Maximum of six core courses per semester
- Extended Essay (EE): 4,000-word research essay on a topic of special interest
- Theory of Knowledge (TOK): 1-credit critical thinking/ inquiry based course with a required exhibition and 1,600- word essay
- Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS): 18 months of continuous hours in artistic pursuits, athletics, and/or community service work for appreciation of life outside the classroom
