

## The Compass Fellowship



**Carroll School trains teachers.** In an effort to address the greatest need of each child, we recognize that diversity and inclusivity are essential to a child's learning experience, as are effective teachers. That's why we've established the Compass Fellowship. Carroll's compass, from which the Fellowship draws its name, embodies the essence of our school's mission. This mission is rooted in the commitment to fostering a diverse community of educators, both at Carroll and outside the school.

**About the Fellowship:** The Fellowship is a 12-month intensive residency-based graduate program. This means Fellowship recipients spend a year-long residency at Carroll School while completing a masters degree. It provides an opportunity for 2 educators from historically marginalized communities to obtain a collaborative masters degree and licensure in Moderate Disabilities PreK-8 or 5-12 with Lesley University, including free Orton-Gillingham training and certification. The chosen candidates will receive a full scholarship for tuition; in addition to scholarship monies, both fellows will receive a \$40,000 taxable living stipend.

**Recruitment:** August 1, 2024 - April 12, 2025

1. Completed undergraduate degree.
