What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools. The goals of Title I are to provide a high quality education for ALL children, provide extra supports to students in need, to reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments, and to increase parental involvement within schools.

How are Central Greene Title I funds used?

Central Greene uses its Title I funds to support reading interventions, class size reduction teachers, school and classroom supplies, professional development for faculty, staff, and parents, technology, educational software, remediation materials, homeless resources, and parent involvement.
