WHY DOES THE TROY SCHOOL DISTRICT LEVY A

HOLD HARMELSS MILLAGE?

The hold harmless millage was established in 1994 with the passage of Proposal A. This unique millage option was made available to school districts where communities were already contributing a higher operational amount per student than mandated by Proposal A. To maintain the high-level educational program offered by the Troy School District, residents approved the hold harmless millage. While revenue from this millage has gradually declined due to adjustments in the school funding formula, its renewal is an important part of the school district's operational budget.

Hold Harmless Millage

If these millages are not renewed by Troy voters, the school district **WILL LOSE \$42.5 MILLION IN OPERATING REVENUE.** This will require substantial reductions in the educational programming. All registered voters living in the Troy School District can vote on this proposal at the polls on November 5 (or by absentee ballot).

Millage Renewal

The hold harmless millage was first approved by Troy voters in 1994 with the approval of Proposal A.

The hold harmless millage supports the operational budget for the Troy School District.
