SUMMARY OF SPRING 2024 RESULTS

The District's goal is to ensure that **all students** are provided with schools that are **safe, positive** and have an **environment that is conducive to learning**. The District is committed to non-discrimination in discipline practices and treating all students **fairly and equitably**.

As required by the stipulated agreement with the Department of Justice, the OUHSD is required to provide a twice yearly community information bulletin that shares data and updates on how the District is improving its discipline policies, procedures, and practices, the terms and implementation of substantive provisions in the Judgment.

WELLNESS CENTERS



In September 2023, Butte County Office of Education, in partnership with local LEAs including OUHSD, applied for a **BiPartisan Safer Communities Stronger Connections Grant (SCG)**. The grant plan included placing **wellness coaches and two certificated clinicians** in 12 schools meeting SCG criteria. In January 2024, the consortium was awarded \$4.1 million over 4 years to implement the project. **Each OUHSD site has a full-time wellness coach throughout the school year.** These coaches provide 1:1 brief support to students, assist with Tier I and II PBIS supports, social-emotional psychoeducation, wellness planning, case management, linkage to Tier III supports, and community and family outreach.
