Early College Option Program: Students may choose to enroll in the Early College Option Program beginning their ninth-grade year. Early College blends high school and college work in a rigorous yet supportive program, compressing the time it takes to complete both a high school diploma and an associate college degree. The only AP level course students take is English III AP. All courses in the junior and senior year are dual enrollment courses as denoted on their transcript.
