Bi-Literacy Pathway

Completion of a foreign language sequence and state-approved foreign language assessment

Advanced Regents with Mastery

Mastery in Math

Students who receive an 85 or higher on 3 Math Regent exams will receive a Mastery In Math notation on their diploma.

Mastery in Science

Students who receive an 85 or higher on 3 Science Regent exams will receive a Mastery In Science notation on their diploma.

Students who wish to retake a Regents exam for a higher score **MUST** speak with their counselor to sign up for the exam ASAP
