

Early Childhood Academy

Early childhood learning lays the foundation for lifelong success, shaping young minds with critical skills and fostering a love for exploration. Our two early childhood academies serve 1,200 pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students. The curriculum focuses on developing memory and cognitive flexibility. The classrooms feature thematic learning designs that play a pivotal role, creating immersive environments that captivate students' imaginations and enhance their learning experiences. 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STEM/P-TECH Academy


The new P-Tech designation will continue to provide students the opportunity to earn college credit and receive industry certifications at no cost. In partnership with San Jacinto Community College, students have the potential to earn 60+ college credit hours towards a STEM-related associate degree. The high school STEM program became the STEM/P-TECH Academy (Pathways in Technology Early College High School) with 392 students grades 9-12.

Early College High School

Sheldon Early College High School is a school-within-a-school model where students take all pre-advanced placement and advanced placement classes. Dual credit courses are offered in partnership with San Jacinto College. The Class of 2024 had 31 seniors graduate with their Associates degree with no expense incurred to their families. Sheldon's ECHS earned the maximum number of distinctions (3) from Texas Education Agency.





Advanced Academics

Did you know that Advanced Academics offers college credits from University of Texas in Austin, along with college credits from San Jacinto Community College? UT On-Ramps courses are taken at King High School; however, college credit is earned from University of Texas. More than 100 students earned at least 6 hours from the University of Texas. In addition, 835 students earned college credits during the 2023-2024 academic school year.

Special Education

Our Special Education Department is dedicated to providing personalized, inclusive support that empowers every student to reach their full potential and succeed in a nurturing, adaptive learning

environment. The team provides specialized services to 1,519 students. We offer an annual Abilities Day for students in our self-contained program that features fun competitions and team building with volunteer opportunities from career and technical education students.

Newcomer Students

The district provides Newcomer students specialized classes during their first years enrolled in the United States to include English for Speakers of Other Languages and sheltered classes for core content classes with teachers trained in Content-Based Language Instruction. These classes provide students new to the country accelerated English acquisition in the English Learners Language Arts and English Language Development & Acquisition elective courses. The Newcomer Academy Centers are located at King Middle School and King High School.

Family Engagement

Family involvement and community engagement are essential pillars of student success, creating a robust support network that extends beyond the classroom. By actively participating in our educational programs and local initiatives, families and community members help to enrich the learning experience and foster a collaborative environment that benefits every student.

Annual Events

The Back to School Bash and Movie Night and the Community Fall Festival provide resources for families and opportunities to engage with our community.

More than 200 runners registered for the Sheldon Shuffle 5K bringing in \$10,000 for the Sheldon Education Foundation. To date the Education Foundation has given more than \$200,000 in grants to teachers in SISD.









Volunteers play a crucial role in schools by providing valuable support that enhances educational experiences and fosters a sense of community. Their contributions help bridge gaps, enrich learning environments, and inspire students to reach their full potential. Sheldon ISD has increased our Families in Action volunteer program to nearly double the amount of active volunteers from last school year with more than 1,900 participants.





After-School Program

The 21st Century After-School Program is offered on 8 Sheldon ISD Campuses. The Anita M. Lowey 21st Century Grant provides funding for 7 campuses, while 1 campus (KMS) is fee-based. The after-school program provides experiences to students beyond the bell hours, keeping students safe and engaged from 3 - 6 p.m.

Teacher of the Year

Sheldon Lake Elementary School teacher Taylor Brock is the Region 4 Elementary Teacher of the Year. Ms. Brock was selected from hundreds of elementary teachers across Region 4. This is the first time in more than 20 years a Sheldon ISD teacher has achieved this honor.

Teachers Welcome

Sheldon ISD welcomed 121 new teachers to the district.

Apprentice Program

The Sheldon ISD Apprenticeship program is designed to provide hands-on training for future educators in kindergarten through 12th grade classrooms. Participants are able to earn their teaching degree and complete the required certifications, while receiving on-the-job training with a seasoned mentor teacher in Sheldon ISD. There are 25 employees participating in the inaugural program.

Teacher Incentive Allotment

Sheldon ISD surprised 16 teachers with the news that they have earned a designation through the Texas Teacher Incentive Allotment resulting in significant salary increases. The Teacher Incentive Allotment (TIA) program is a new Sheldon ISD initiative to reward, retain and recruit highly effective teachers on every campus while providing a realistic pathway for top teachers to earn six-figure salaries.

During the 86th Legislative Session, funding to support the Teacher Incentive Allotment was built into Texas state law as part of House Bill 3. This funding source established the ability for Sheldon ISD to implement a local designation system to recognize effective teachers on three different levels: Recognized, Exemplary and Master. Based on state qualifying criteria, Sheldon ISD has designated 14 Recognized teachers and 2 Exemplary teachers. Thanks to the funding made available from the state, Sheldon ISD will receive approximately \$110,000 to disperse to these 16 educators based on their Recognized or Exemplary distinction.

The funding is provided to the teachers annually through additional compensation for the next five years as long as they continue to meet the Teacher Incentive Allotment requirements.

The Early Learning Center is a perk for Sheldon ISD employees' children and grandchildren of employees ages 6 weeks to four years old. The curriculum, ratios, environment design, teacher requirements and program training follows the guidelines of the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). Our approach to learning provide students hands-on experiences with language, math, science, art and music that are developmentally appropriate for their age.



On the Grow

In November 2022, Sheldon ISD voters approved a \$247.7 million bond proposal. The passing of the bond allowed Sheldon ISD to begin building a new 9th and 10th Grade Campus as well as expand Null Middle School and Cravens Early Childhood. Additionally, there will be district-wide facility sustainments and improvements, upgrades to safety and security, new buses purchased with GPS tracking systems and upgrades to classroom technology.


