ADORATION OF BLESSED SACRAMENT
















Our Academy recently had a special morning of Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament at our church. They prayed, meditated, and sang songs of praise for our Lord.

LESSON ON VENN DIAGRAMS







PK4 students learned about Venn diagrams. Venn diagrams are great tool to visually help development language skills for letter recognition and cognitive skills for organizing information.



MYSTERY READER








The students enjoyed a story read to them by one of the class mothers who was the surprise Mystery Reader this month.







6TH GRADE - WORLD HISTORY

SCIENCE LESSON WITH SCIENTIFIC TOOLS




















Ms. Gaby's 7th and graders had fun in an engaging science lesson that used different scientific tools, including the microscope.
