PROFILE OF THE CLASS OF 2025 50th Graduating Class

THE HIGH SCHOOL AND ITS FACULTY

Blind Brook High School is consistently rated as a top performing high school nationally and has been recognized three times by the US Department of Education and New York state as a National Blue Ribbon School. In 2024, 100% of our graduates who applied to institutions of higher education were accepted, with **98% attending four year colleges/universities**. The faculty has distinguished itself as one of the finest in Westchester County having continually demonstrated a commitment to teaching and to their academic disciplines. 100% of our teaching staff has earned advanced degrees, 2% of whom have Doctoral degrees. Teachers and students regularly participate in after-school academic and co-curricular activities. One hundred students are enrolled in the June 2024 graduating class.

THE COMMUNITY

The Blind Brook-Rye School District is a small suburban district with an expected enrollment of 1324 students in 2024-25. The community served by the school system has a population of approximately 6,500 and is located within the Village of Rye Brook in southeastern Westchester County, about thirty miles north of New York City. The community enjoys a history of strong support for education.

ACCREDITATION

Blind Brook High School is accredited by the University of the State of New York.

GRADING POLICY and CLASS RANK

Blind Brook High School does not rank students but provides grade point average (GPA) information that includes all courses using a 100 point scale. Courses are not weighted. Juniors and seniors are permitted to enroll in one course for graduation as pass/fail.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to complete a New York State minimum of 22 credits, including:

- 4.0 Credits of English
- 4.0 Credits of Social Studies
- 3.0 Credits of Math
- 3.0 Credits of Science
- 1.0 Credit of World Language
- 2.0 Credits of Physical Education
- 1.0 Credit of Fine or Performing Arts
- 0.5 Credit of Health

Blind Brook students graduate having earned an average of *twenty-nine* credits. All students must complete a minimum of *eighty hours* of community service prior to graduation.

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ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Blind Brook students may enroll in Advanced Placement courses commencing in Grade 10. We offered 19 Advanced Placement courses in the 2023-24 school year. We have open enrollment into AP Courses. **Of the Class of 2025, 84% have enrolled in at least 1 AP Course.**

In May 2024, 184 students wrote 447 examinations.

- 91% of Blind Brook High School students scored 3 or higher on the AP test.
- 66% of Blind Brook High School students received scores of 4 or 5

COLLEGE CREDIT COURSES

Many of our students engage in dual enrollment courses throughout their time at Blind Brook High School commencing in Grade 11. Through these courses, students have the opportunity to earn credit provided the students meet college/university criteria.
