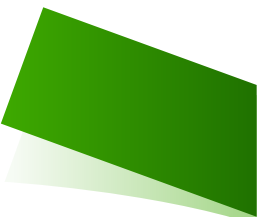
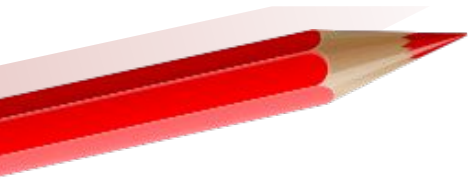

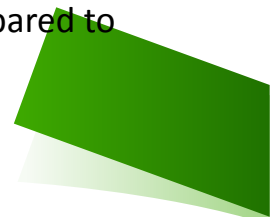


# District Goals



## 3 Big Rocks Attendance, Core/Intervention, School Culture

1. Increase Kindergarten Readiness: Enhance the number of students ready for Kindergarten as assessed by the state DIBELS assessment.
2. K-3 Literacy Growth: Demonstrate growth in K-3 Literacy using DIBELS Benchmark Assessments.
3. Grades 3-8 Literacy Growth: Show growth in literacy for students in Grades 3-8 through the Lexia Tier I Intervention Program.
4. K-8 Math Growth: Demonstrate growth in math for students in Grades K-8 using the Zearn Tier I Intervention Program.
5. High School Reading Growth: Show growth in reading for high school students using the Power-Up Tier I Reading Intervention Program.
6. Increase Dual Enrollment Credits: Boost the number of high school students earning Dual Enrollment Credits during the first semester compared to last year during the same period.







# School Goals



1. By the end of the 2024-25 school year, HEML will increase the SPS score by 3 points as measured by the SPS calculator.
2. By the end of the 2024-25 school year, HEML will increase the percentage of K-3 students reading at or above grade level from 36% to 41% as measured by DIBELS.
3. By the end of the 2024-25 school year, HEML will increase the percentage of 3rd-5th grade students scoring at mastery or above from 23% to 26% in ELA as measured by LEAP 2025.
4. By the end of the 2024-25 school year, HEML will increase the percentage of 3rd-5th grade students scoring at mastery or above from 21% to 24% in Math as measured by LEAP 2025.
5. By the end of the 2024-25 school year, HEML will increase the percentage of 3rd-5th grade students scoring at mastery or above from 17% to 20% in Science as measured by LEAP 2025.
6. By the end of the 2024-25 school year, HEML will increase the percentage of 3rd - 5th grade Sub Group students scoring at mastery or above from 3% to 5% as measured by LEAP 2025.
7. By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, HEML will increase attendance rate by 3 percentage points.
8. HEML will reduce the number of office referrals by 10% from 604 to 549.

# Priority Needs

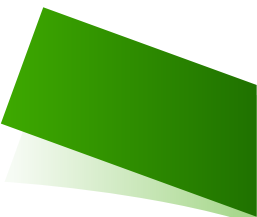


- Continued work on getting student behavior in line so the overall school environment feels safe and capable of students to learn.
  - Authenticity and integrity across the board in grading /scoring student work
  - Ensure all teachers are teaching the Tier I Curriculum so the next grade can build on previous years knowledge
  - Improve fidelity to intervention model with emphasis on improving opportunity for math intervention
  - Improve frequency of classroom support for teachers
  - providing scaffolding and supports to ensure all students have access to Tier I Curriculums (planning)
  - Improve student and teacher attendance
  - Increase the number of students reading on grade level
  - Increase the percentage of students scoring mastery and above in math, science, social studies, and ELA
  - Strengthen writing in all content areas (i.e. writing and supporting claims in social studies & science and explaining/defending thinking in math)

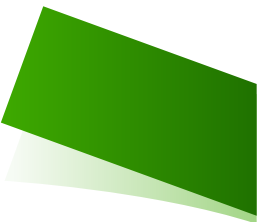
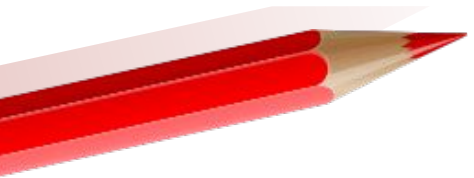

## How you can help...



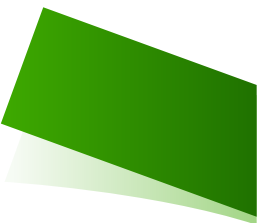
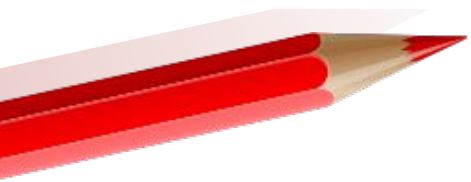
1. Support your child's teachers by ensuring your children have the materials they need each day for class.

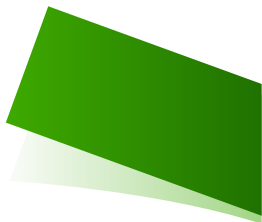
# Club Day!!
