Illness and Sick Day Guidelines

Please keep your child home if he or she:

-Has a fever of 100.0 or higher

-Has been vomiting or episodes of diarrhea.


-Eyes that are red with drainage, itching


-Has symptoms that prevent them from participating in school, such as excessive tiredness or lack of appetite.

-Headache, body aches, earache that continues with pain reliever.

Keep your child home until his or her fever has gone down for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication. Diarrhea needs to have ended for 24 hours before returning per the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

CONSENT AND RELEASE





If you do not wish to have your child's voice reproduced on tape or to have his/her image appear in such things as a video or a photograph, or on the school or school system website or social media, please notify the school principal in writing. It is assumed that parents and guardians consent to their children being audiotaped, photographed, videotaped, or having their image placed on a school website or social media by the school system unless such notification is received.

There are also occasions when the media cover certain school events (such as when a government leader visits a school). If you do not wish to have your child's name or likeness published by the media, you should address your concerns directly to the school involved so that the media is so advised. Please be advised that the school system has no control over the media when they are covering activities such as sporting events and musical programs that are open to the public.

There may be times throughout the year when the Carroll County Public School System wishes to display student work on school websites, social media, or in publications. If you do not wish to have your child's art, poetry, writing, etc. appear on school websites, social media, or in publications, please notify the school principal in writing. SUBJECT: Fast Track Child Care Scholarship Application Process and Family Portal

The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) recently launched a new fast track Child Care Scholarship (CCS) application process and Child Care Family Portal to expedite the application process for eligible families and make it easier for families to receive financial assistance with child care expenses.

Beginning July 1, 2023, the Division of Early Childhood's Child Care Scholarship program grants temporary eligibility determination to applicants within three business days. Eligible families will receive 60 days of temporary child care assistance under the CCS program and will be provided with a pathway to a full, 52-week Child Care Scholarship. Prior to the fast track process, families would have to wait up to 35 days for their application to be fully processed to receive assistance.

We are reaching out to ask for your partnership in sharing this opportunity with as many Maryland families as possible. To make this seamless, we are providing email and newsletter templates, flyers, sample social media posts, and graphics for you to share with your networks and beyond! We encourage you to use these resources to help Marylanders learn about the availability, application process, eligibility requirements, and benefits of the Child Care Scholarship program. This program not only supports families with infants and toddlers, but also serves families with children up to 13 years old who may need support with paying for child care and children up to age 19 with a medically documented disability that does not enable them to provide self-care.

There are a number of ways that you can help share the Scholarship program with your communities:

- Promote on social media. Write a social media post that excites and links to the website,
 money4childcare.com. Use the #money4childcare hashtag to promote it and don't forget to tag us
 @MdPublicSchools. Graphics and sample language in English and Spanish are included in the atached
 toolkit.
- Send an email and/or include messaging in a newsleter. Include a message that informs your network about the fast track applica on process and Family Portal in an email or newsleter. Provide them with the links to the website and let them know they can get more program informa on and instructons on how to apply on the website. See the atached toolkit for examples in English and Spanish.
- Join the conversa �on. Engage in Twiter chats and share posi �ve social media messages that others are pos �ong about the CCS program.
