# National Homeless Youth Awareness Month Social Media Messages

### Context



November is National Homeless Youth Awareness Month (#NHYAM), a month originally designated by the United States Congress in 2007 to build awareness of the issue of youth homelessness, including its causes and potential solutions, and highlight the need to work to prevent homelessness among children and teens. November is also Youth HOPE Month (#youthHOPEmonth), a public awareness campaign spearheaded by the National Runaway Safeline to shine a light on the experiences of runaway and homeless youth that too often remain invisible.

Did you know that youth without a high school credential are 346% more likely to experience homelessness than their peers who completed high school? #NHYAM #youthHOPEmonth

Did you know that young parents—especially those unmarried— are 200% more likely to experience homelessness than their non-parenting peers? #NHYAM #youthHOPEmonth

Did you know that low-income youth are 162% more likely to experience homelessness than youth of higher income levels? #NHYAM #youthHOPEmonth

Did you know that youth experiencing homelessness often move between different arrangements, including staying in shelter, unsheltered locations, and with other people temporarily because they have nowhere else to go? #NHYAM #youthHOPEmonth
