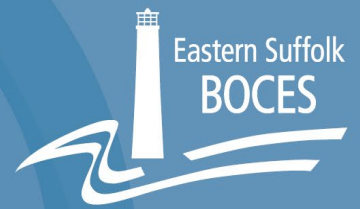

Unpacking the NYS Literacy Initiative Briefs for Elementary Schools – Deborah Linscott-Feinstein & Lauren Kolbeck

October 29, 2024 • Audience: Grades 5-12, All Content Areas

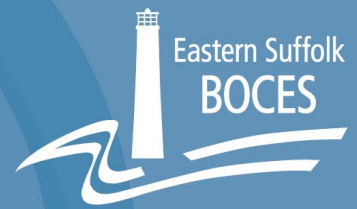

Her credentials include graduate degrees in literacy and school building administration. She works as a literacy consultant in New York and Connecticut.



Erik Lepis, co-founder of The Living Literacy Network consults regionally, nationally, and internationally to provide professional development to teachers and leaders on a wide range of literacy topics. With 30 years of experience as teachers and coaches in a variety of urban and suburban settings across grades K-8, and advanced degrees with certifications in early childhood education, general and special education, literacy, educational leadership, Orton-Gillingham, Foundations, as well as credentials in the science of teaching reading, the powerhouse team offers through the teaching of reading and writing. They work closely with schools and districts to help leaders develop a vision for literacy instruction, raise student achievement, and lead school-wide change.

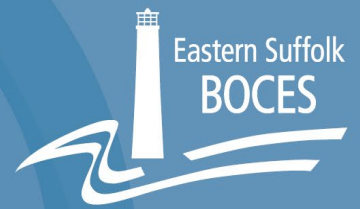

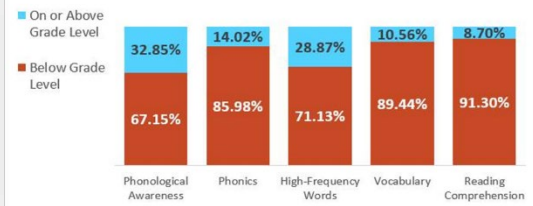

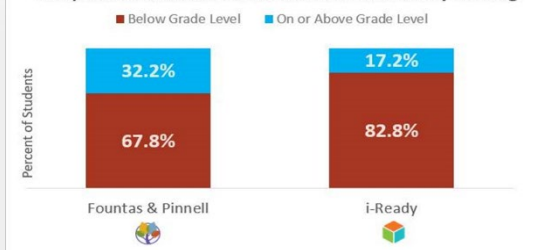

Comparison Between Fountas & Pinnell and i-Ready Reading

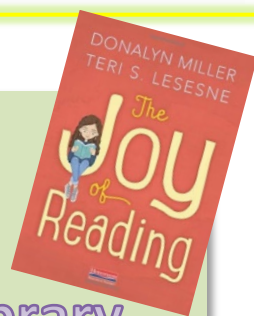

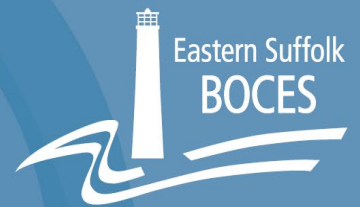
Eastern Suffolk BOCES Bay Shore Summer Enrichment Literacy Program

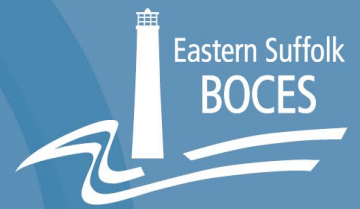
ESBOCES Central Islip Summer Enrichment Literacy Program
