Superintendent's Notebook by Eric Lutinski, Ed.D.

Greetings to our extended Rye Neck community! In an era of websites, emails, and texts, I'm glad that we have not fully let go of "good old fashioned" print communication. I appreciate the simplicity and ease of reading actual books, magazines, newspapers, and of course, our Value Education newsletter, which is sent directly to every mailbox in the RNUFSD district.



Our campuses are busy places and July and August were no exceptions. We had two large projects commence this summer: the first being a full repaving and site work at Daniel Warren, which was substantially completed for the start of school. Completed portions of the project include paving and drainage work, a new fenced-in enclosure for our dumpsters and compost bins, and a new stormwater management system with underground rechargers. Still to be completed are portions of the fencing, as well as lighting along the path to the Florence Street lot. We anticipate that this project will be fully complete by the end of October.

The second project involves the restoration of the former walking and bike path and preservation of a portion of the temporary parking lot at the MS/HS. The new bike and walking path has been installed and was ready for use on the first day of school. The rest of the project will continue throughout September. Once completed, we will have over 30 new (and much needed) parking spaces.

We are thankful for the community and its support of both of these projects. The Daniel Warren work is part of the approved use of our 2022 Capital Reserve Fund. This project, along with others, was approved by the community at the May 2024 vote. The restoration of the bike and walking path, as well as making a permanent parking lot, was made possible by inclusion of transfer to capital in our annual budget.

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Board of Education Update by Jason Carmel, President

The start of the academic year is a time of new beginning for the Board of Education as well as the students, teachers, and staff at Rye Neck. We welcomed two new members of the Board, Nikki Barker and Halli Gatenio. Jason Carmel was elected Board President after Rebecca Mansell, last year's president, finished her term.



Erica Wagner will continue as Vice President of the Board. We met for a retreat on August 21st to establish our goals for the year, which will be published on the Board section of our newly designed website.

Our goals for this year encompass the main duties of the Board: setting policy, financial stewardship, and oversight of the Superintendent. For policy, we are engaging in a two-year overhaul of our policy manual through the New York State School Board Association. This service will bring our policies in line with model policies while enabling us to respond to our local needs where appropriate. For financial stewardship, we are engaging in long-term financial planning that will address the renewal of the teacher contract and the building conditions survey that we completed last year. Our goal is to retain talent and improve facilities while keeping under the state tax cap. Finally, we will work with Superintendent Lutinski to ensure that the district is managed expertly. A key component for this year is to execute on the goals of our district's strategic plan. You will see that the overall goals will turn into specific and measurable strategies with timelines for each.

We want to make sure that our Board meetings and deliberations are as transparent as possible. The schedule of full board meetings is available, and the agenda for the meetings will be published the week before each meeting. The approximate times for each agenda item has been added in case community members want to come for

We look forward to the completion of both of these projects and to starting the other projects that were approved at the May 2024 vote as part of the use of the 2022 Capital Reserve Fund, including a new lower roof at the MS/HS gymnasium; masonry repairs at both Daniel Warren and F.E. Bellows; as well as engaging our architect to perform an athletic field study to assess the current layout of the fields at the MS/HS, an analysis of adding additional HVAC capacity at Daniel Warren and F.E. Bellows, and exploring an energy performance contract to update district lighting, electrical panels, and end of life HVAC units.

Finally, we eagerly kicked off the new school year with our

Rye Neck Strategic Plan in place. Our collective "head, heart, and hands" represent our target areas for change. Over the course of the next year and half, we will be working to equip all learners to approach problems successfully; to build transformative environments in and outside of the classroom; and to design



systems that will allow our professional learning community to create transformative learning experiences. 2024-25 is our first step toward a broad new horizon for the Rye Neck learning community.

Tenure Candidates

The Rye Neck School District is committed to recruiting and retaining excellent teachers. There are several mechanisms in place to ensure that our professional staff meets this goal, including ongoing feedback from the superintendent, principals, department supervisors, directors and chairs.

Each of these professionals brings a unique and important perspective to the process and works individually with nontenured teachers to foster professional development and provide support. These professional relationships help staff members reflect on their practice, grow and make appropriate adiustments.

From a formal perspective, district administrators utilize a comprehensive evaluation process, frequently observing and evaluating each new staff member to offer suggestions, monitor progress and assess improvement. A four-year probationary period is required before new teachers/administrators receive tenure and a three-year period for teachers who have previously held tenure in another public school district in New York State.

Parents can provide valuable insights and should do so, first to the staff member directly, since this feedback would be most helpful to him/her. Once parents have spoken to the teacher, they may also wish to share their thoughts with the individual building principal or
