Student Guidance and Counseling Services

We are committed to providing our students with a comprehensive guidance and counseling program to include:

Guidance curriculum to help students develop their full educational potential, including the student's interests and career objectives. Topics included are:

Per FFEA(LEGAL) parents or guardians may request to view materials used during the year by making an appointment during school hours.

Passive Consent

School counselors are available to assist students with a wide range of personal concerns, including such areas as social, family, emotional, mental health, or substance abuse. A student may request to visit the school counselor's office and parents may request resources from a counselor. In order to meet the personal needs of students, school counselors may also offer support groups on a recurring basis. If a parent/guardian does not want their student to participate in a support group, written documentation of denial of services will need to be provided to the school counselor.

College, Career, and Military Preparation (CCMR) - Texas Education Agency requires all Texas high school students be college, career, and military ready after high school. Students at Clear Horizons earn this requirement by completing dual credit hours, completing the TSIA, and earning an associate degree.

CCISD/Clear Horizons in partnership with San Jacinto College South provides over 130 dual credit courses where students can earn an associate's degree while earning their high school diploma. College elec-

tives provide opportunities for students to explore career pathways in preparation for a four-year degree.
