Where We Are in Place and Time: Investigating orientation in place and time, personal histories, and the interconnectedness of individuals and civilizations.

How We Express Ourselves: Understanding the ways in which we discover and express ideas, feelings, culture, beliefs, and values.

How the World Works: Exploring the natural world and its laws, the interaction between the natural world and human societies.

How We Organize Ourselves: Investigating human systems and communities, the structure and function of organizations, and societal decision-making processes.

Sharing the Planet: Understanding rights and responsibilities in the struggle to share finite resources with other people and other living things.
