WORK-BASED LEARNING

A **work-based learning (WBL) experience** connects a student with a local business who assigns meaningful and authentic career-related experiences. The school, student, and workplace mentor create a training plan to guide the student's WBL experience. Through this experience, a student will develop specific career-related skills, as well as a variety of employability skills, necessary for success in today's workforce.

Who Participates in Work-Based Learning?

To be eligible for a work-based learning experience, students must be enrolled in the **capstone course** of a **career pathway**. Carmel High School currently offers 27 career pathways. Each pathway offers a four-course sequence featuring a principles course, two advanced courses, and a culminating capstone course. For the pathways listed below, the capstone course features work-based learning experiences with a local business.

Through our career capstone courses, Carmel High School aims to connect highly motivated students who are eager to apply what they have learned through three years of career-related coursework with employers who are interested in investing in the future of our city and our state.

The Work-Based Learning Schedule

CHS students follow a “block schedule” and attend different classes every other day. Student interns are typically scheduled to work offsite for two consecutive blocks. This allows the student complete meaningful work for a minimum of 3 hours every other day. Paid interns may choose to work prior to or after their assigned release times. As example, a student may start work at 7:00 AM and work until Noon. Please note that CHS has a “late start” every other Wednesday, which slightly impacts release times for our students.

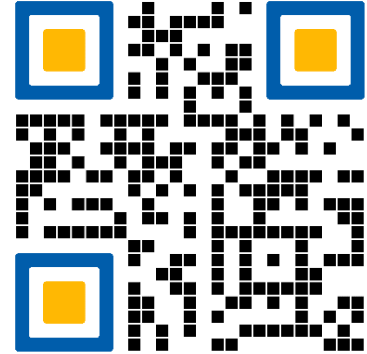

Blue-Gold Calendar



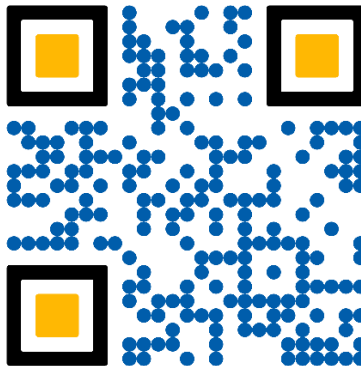
Late Start Schedule
