

# Navigating the College Application Process

- Apply, request letters of recommendation and transcripts, send test scores (if sending them) (September-December depending on deadlines)
- 3. Apply for Financial Aid (FAFSA) (December)
- 4. Apply for scholarships (September-May)

### Get Organized

### Decision Deadlines:

- Early Action
  - (Apply early. Get decision early. No commitment. More scholarships)
- Early Decision
  - (Apply early. Get decision early. BINDING commitment to the college---you can only apply to one school ED)
- Regular Decision
   (Later application deadline. Usually Jan. or Feb. Less scholarship opportunities)
- Rolling Admission
   (No set deadline. Applications accepted until spots are full)

### Ways to Apply

### Common App

You can apply to multiple colleges using one common application

w/Schoolinks commonapp.orq

### College Website

You can apply to an individual college via their website

You MUST connect your account Some schools don't use Common App

### Considerations

If you are applying to schools with competitive admissions, here is what is considered:

- GPA and Strength of Transcript
- Test Scores (if submitting)
- Essay
- Work Experience or Extracurriculars
- Leadership and volunteer experience
- Recommendations (if using)

# Set up Schoolinks and Send Documents



#### Application Documents to Send to the College

- HS Transcript (request in Schoolinks, sent by high school)
- CCP Transcript (request from college, sent directly from college)
- Test Scores (if sending, MUST Send through test agency website)
- Letters of Recommendation (request in Schoolinks, sent by high school)
- Essay(s) (submit in Common App or attach to application)

# Letters of Recommendation

#### Things to consider:

- 1. Are letters of recommendation required? If so, how many?
- Pick someone familiar with your work ethic and character (If more than one required, choose at least one teacher in a subject area similar to your major)
- 3. Always ask IN PERSON FIRST
- Request a letter in Schoolinks and allow plenty of time (at least two weeks)
- 5. Outside Recommenders are allowed (coach, manager, youth pastor, etc.) THESE GET REQUESTED IN COMMON APP

#### What should you write about?

- Something that matters to you
- Something that makes you uniquely you!
- Challenges and Strengths
- Something that you have overcome

Essays

Have someone PROOFREAD it!!!
Again, allow plenty of time if asking a teacher to proofread it!

### Schoolinks

#### Go to app.schoolinks.com

- → Login with Google
- → You will choose Colleges from left-hand menu
  - Choose College Applications
  - ◆ You MUST fill out the information they ask before you can move forward (profile info, Fee Waiver questions, and FERPA Waiver)
  - Connect Schoolinks to your Common App account (on left-hand side) or choose ADD APPLICATION on right-hand side if applied directly on college website

# Steps for Applying w/Common App:

- Complete Common App Checklist and Sign FERPA waiver (You will sign the FERPA waiver twice...once in Schoolinks and once in Common App)
- 2. Complete all required parts of the Common App
- 3. IF you are asking for a letter of recommendation from a coach, employer, clergy, family friend, etc, you will request in the "Other Recommenders" tab in Common App (all teacher recs will be requested from Schoolinks)
- 4. Your essay(s) and/or personal statement must be done in Common App
- 5. You must complete the questions tab for each individual school before submitting

# Steps for Applying to Non-Common App Schools:

- Select the Add application button at the top right and search for the school
- Answer the questions about what kind of application, will you submit test scores, applying for financial aid, etc.
- Apply via the school's website
- Once all things have been complete, mark them as complete so that the application moves into the next column



# Tips for Success:

- Get organized (keep all of your college info in one place)
- Know your deadlines and ALLOW PLENTY OF TIME for items to get completed on our end!
- Don't Procrastinate!!!
