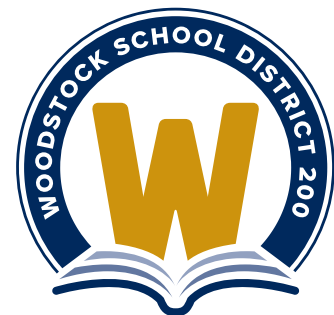

A collaboration between Woodstock District 200 and McHenry County College now offers just that.

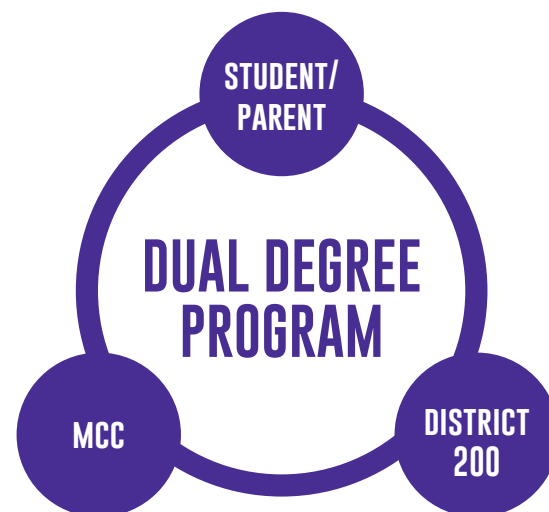

WHO IS THE DUAL DEGREE PROGRAM FOR?

High school students who are highly motivated, willing to challenge themselves with a rigorous course load, and plan to pursue additional educational opportunities beyond high school.

WHAT TO EXPECT AS A DUAL DEGREE STUDENT

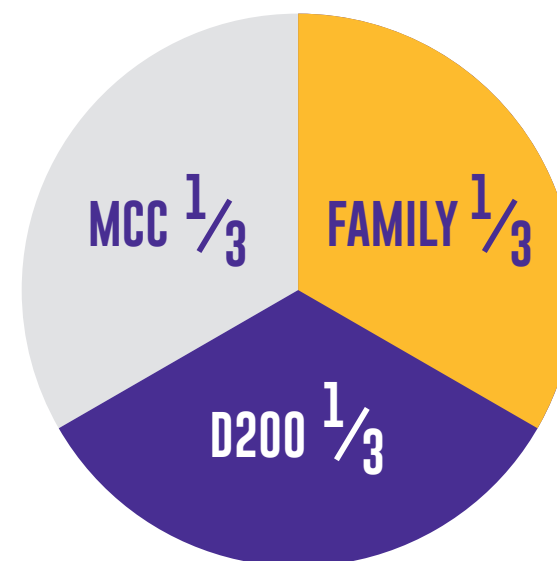
- ➔ Individualized advising sessions
- ➔ Orientation session for students and parents
- ➔ Flexible scheduling
- ➔ Strong communication between MCC, D200, and student/parent



PROGRAM COST

The cost of the Dual Degree Program is split equally. Families pay one third, MCC pays one third, and D200 pays one third. Students who take a dual credit course at a D200 high school pay \$25 to MCC. Free/reduced students cost is waived.

Families are responsible for books and materials for courses taught at MCC.
