Traditionally, 4th grade students studied California on a week long trip. This year we proposed a shorter overnight trip to Sea World, to reintroduce this age group to student travel. Under the leadership of Stephanie Baker, along with 4 other staff, approximately 35 students will travel Thursday, October 3, through Friday, October 4, 2024. The trip includes transportation to Sea World, dinner, overnight campout at Sea World in an exhibit venue including fun and interactive lessons, activities, breakfast, snacks, admission to the park on Friday, lunch in park and a T-shirt. Students will also visit Old Town San Diego and be provided with a glimpse of California history.





Under the leadership of Winnie Joe approximately 50 students and 5 chaperones will travel to the Pali Institute. They are one of the only residential, outdoor education programs. Students will study environmental impact. The trip is scheduled for November 25th to 27th. The trip includes all transportation, housing, fees, activity costs, and all meals.
