

PROPOSITION 2 (2024)

Proposition 2 would issue \$10 billion in bonds with \$8.5 billion dedicated to elementary and secondary educational facilities and \$1.5 billion for community college facilities. The measure would have required the state government to cover between 50 and 55% of construction project costs and 60 and 65% of modernization project costs.



CALIFORNIA IS REPAYING AN ESTIMATED \$80 BILLION IN BONDED DEBT AND IS AUTHORIZED TO SELL AN OUTSTANDING \$35 BILLION IN BONDS. THE STATE SPENDS APPROXIMATELY \$6 BILLION FROM THE GENERAL FUND (3% OF THE TOTAL FUND) EACH YEAR TO REPAY BONDS. THE OFFICE ESTIMATED THAT THE COST TO REPAY PROPOSITION 2 WOULD BE AN ESTIMATED \$500 MILLION ANNUALLY FOR 35 YEARS
