- Last week marked the start of Hispanic Heritage Month, and we observed the month last Monday morning with a special reading during the morning announcements. Here is the text of that announcement:

"This morning, we mark the start of Hispanic Heritage Month, which began yesterday. Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 to October 15, by celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of Americans whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

"September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16 and September 18, respectively. The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded to a full month by President Ronald Reagan in 1988. The national theme for this year's Hispanic Heritage Month is "Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together."

"Latinos represent approximately 19% of the US population. However, nationwide Latinos make up less than 4% of corporate executive roles and just 8% of all positions in the tech sector. Because of disparities such as these, Hispanic Heritage Month is more than a celebration—it is a call to action. It highlights the pressing need for greater recognition of the important contributions of the Hispanic community in shaping our nation's future. By educating society and fostering dialogue, Hispanic Heritage Month plays a pivotal role in combating discrimination and promoting a more inclusive future.

## **Career of the Week: Web Developers**

<u>Web Developers</u> create and maintain websites. Digital designers develop, create, and test website or interface layout, functions, and navigation for usability",(Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2023). <u>Web Developers and Digital Designers</u> are employed in almost every industry. Training varies in this field from college degrees to high school diplomas. The median salary is \$84,960 for Web Developers and \$98,540 for Digital Designers. The profession is expected to have *faster than average job growth at 8%* through 2033.

The <u>University of Massachusetts, Boston</u> opened in 1965 as the second campus in the UMASS system. UMB's current campus is located in Dorchester's <u>Columbia Point</u>, approximately 5 miles south of downtown Boston. Known as the "only public research university in Boston", UMB currently enrolls about 16,000 students within its <u>eight colleges</u> and offers over <u>200 majors, minors and certificate programs</u>. Unique programs for undergrads include the <u>School for the Environment</u> and the <u>Honors College</u>.
