LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year 1 have had another busy week! The children have finished reading 'if all the world were' and have been writing special memory books and thank you cards to tie in with the story. In Maths, the children have been practicing counting backwards. In their 'Childhood' topic, the children discussed how humans change from babies to toddlers to children and so on. They then made human timelines.

Ask me: What are the stages of human life?







Year 2 As part of our DT topic, 'Remarkable Recipes' children in year 2 made Eton Mess and vegetable casserole. They had the opportunity to read recipes and practice various culinary skills including mixing, slicing and chopping. In our maths mastery sessions we have been finding the odd numbers 'hidden' in even numbers. In geography, we recapped the names of the continents and oceans using atlases.

Ask me: What are the names of the continents?



Year 3 have had another busy week. They impressed us with their retelling of a section of Pebble in my Pocket and started their new art project 'Colour theory' where they have been learning more about the colour wheel. In science, they learnt the scientific names of the human skeleton – labelling themselves with sticky notes to locate the bones on their body.

Ask me: Name 3 bones in the human skeleton by their scientific name.







Year 4 have chosen stories to read to the reception children. In the classroom, they have been practising telling the stories, trying to learn parts of the story and noting down some of the story language. Year 4 will start reading to the reception children after half term. This is all linked to the big push that Year 4 are having on reading. It has been lovely to see the comments from home in the planners. Due to the huge effort that the children having been putting in at home, several children have moved up a reading level this week. In the lessons we are building a bank of 'story language' to make our story writing more interesting. The children will shortly be writing about one of Arthur's adventures.

Ask me: Who is Arthur?



Reception have been busy continuing their Let's Explore project this week thinking more closely about where they live. They spent time using junk modelling materials to build houses and create towns as well as building dens outside. We have read the story In Every House, On Every Street and the children have spent time talking about who is in their family and the things they do at home and what they do in different rooms. We have also read the story Part of the Party which talks about all families being different.

Ask me: What do you enjoy doing in different parts of the house?
