Granville High School provides students the opportunity to explore world issues and appreciate different perspectives on those topics. GHS was the first in the state to launch—and is one of only two Ohio high schools to offer—the prestigious Global Scholars Diploma program, in partnership with the **Columbus Council on World Affairs**. The first cohort eligible to receive the Global Scholars Diploma was the Class of 2014.

The program allows committed students in grades 9-12 the opportunity to participate in unique experiences both in and out of the classroom. A hallmark of the diploma is the Global Issues course, whose curriculum changes annually based on the topics in the book, *Great Decisions Briefing*. Beyond Global Issues, students follow a specific curriculum and convey their learning via the creation of a portfolio and capstone presentation to earn their certificate indicating "global competence". Students are also afforded opportunities to travel and experience global perspectives first-hand. Since 2014, students have traveled to China, Costa Rica, Peru, Cuba, Japan, Italy, Greece. Educational Land Lab



In 2014, Granville School District became home to an educational land lab. A small group of AP Environmental Science students developed the idea for the outdoor classroom and secured a partnership with Denison University, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Licking County Soil and Water Conservation District. It continues to be used by students and faculty across the district for research and field experiences.

College Credit Plus

Students may participate in the College Credit Plus (CCP) program, which includes taking courses for high school and college credit through local university partners. New for the 2024-2025 school year, students have options within GHS to take courses through Shawnee State University (SSU), Ashland University and Central Ohio Technical College (COTC). In addition, students may opt to take dual enrollment classes through a variety of local options, including Ohio State University-Newark Campus, COTC, Denison University, and Mount Vernon Nazarene University. Courses taken for college credit in disciplines wherein GHS has AP offerings will receive the benefit of the weighted GPA scale.

Ohio Honors Diploma

GHS seniors who complete coursework above the minimum required to graduate, while also earning a GPA of 3.5 or higher and meeting a set SAT or ACT benchmark are eligible to receive the Honors Diploma upon graduation. In 2024, 51% of graduating seniors earned the Honors Diploma.
