Behavior Mission Statement

It is the mission of the Swedesboro-Woolwich School District to be, "A community dedicated to inspiring lifelong learners. At Walter Hill, we emphasize the importance of character, effort, and growth. Our mantra "Here at the Hill" focuses on respect, responsibility, effort, choices, and honesty. The goals at Hill are established by creating a community that honors the importance of relationships amongst all members in the community; as well as practices to repair relationships when harm has been caused.

Below are the mindsets that guide us Here at the Hill

- o Courteous, Kind, and Respectful Behavior is always EXPECTED
- o Listen and Follow Directions
- Time is a Valuable Commodity, Use It Wisely
- Fair isn't everyone getting the same thing, Fair is everyone getting what they need to be Successful
- Rumors and Gossip are like Glitter, they can never be totally cleaned up
- We Encourage; We DO NOT Halt, Hinder, or Bring Down
- We Respect School Property and the Property of Others
- We Come to Class Ready to Learn, and Listen to Our Teachers, Faculty, and Staff

Once it is determined that a student's behavior is of a nature where the disciplinary process must be invoked the Code of Conduct will be used to provide appropriate responses for the level of student behavior. These Steps will be applied consistently across all schools and to all students unless otherwise provided in a student's Behavioral Intervention Plan.

Discipline is a deliberate, proactive process that supports the development of positive social behavior vital to the success of its students. Informed decision is used determining if a student's actions invoke punitive action as outlined in this section of the manual. The Steps shown on the following pages are a guide that will be used as progressive strategies, approaches and administrative responses used to change student behavior. Progressive discipline is the process of using increasingly more severe steps when a student fails to correct a problem after being given a reasonable opportunity to do so. The idea behind this is to use the least severe action necessary to correct the undesirable situation. The goal is to modify the unacceptable behavior. The goal is also to make the student understand they need to correct the behaviors and not to continue doing so, and if the undesired behavior continues further consequences will result.

Positive Behavior Program

The Walter Hill School is committed to creating a positive learning environment where students are academically and socially successful. As part of our strategic plan, we implement Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports, a nationally validated framework for creating a positive school climate.

The Positive Behavior Supports in Schools (PBSIS) framework is associated with increases in positive student outcomes (e.g., increase in instructional time) and decreases behavior infractions as measured by office behavior incident referral and suspension data. In New Jersey consistent high fidelity implementation of PBSIS has resulted in an average of 21% decrease in referrals to the office for behavior infractions and 30% average decrease in out of school suspensions.

Students at Walter Hill have the opportunity to be rewarded for demonstrating good behavior on a weekly and monthly basis. Every student also has the opportunity to earn participation in special behavior incentive events that will be offered throughout the school year.

Classroom Strategies for Behavior and Intervention Strategies

Here at "The Hill" we follow the Big Five Strategies of Classroom Management:

Rules, Routines, Praise, Misbehavior, and Engagement.

When these expectations are not met, we will follow the following strategies:

- -Communication Home (If a referral is submitted to the Principal this communication will be a Phone Call) General communication can be done through virtual means and or phone call.
- -Moving of Student Seat
- -Teacher Student conference outside of class time
- -Parent Teacher Conference
- -Referral to I&RS Committee.
- -Referral to Guidance (if warranted) for repeated non-serious behaviors.
- -Referral to Principal (this step could happen earlier if it deems necessary and meets one of the behaviors listed in our Code of Conduct.)

Administrative Consequences for Violations of the Code of Conduct:

Administrative Warning - Student will have a conference with the building Principal and the Principal will contact the parent and follow-up by teacher.

Lunch Detention - Student will forfeit his/her free lunch and recess time due to a behavior infraction. Student must report to the lunch detention site at his/her designated lunch time and will eat lunch in the detention area.

After-School Detention - A student who is assigned after-school detention will report to the Main Office at the close of the school day where the detention monitor will pick them up. Detention is served from 3:30 PM until 4:30 PM. A parent/guardian is responsible for providing transportation home from detention. The student will also be prohibited from participating in extracurricular or after-school activities on the day of his/her detention.

Twilight Detention - A student who is assigned a twilight detention will report to the proctor's room at dismissal. Twilight is served from 3:30 PM until 5:30 PM. A parent/guardian is responsible for providing transportation home from twilight. The student will also be prohibited from participating in extracurricular or after-school activities on the day of his/her twilight detention.

In-School Suspension (ISS) - A student who receives an internal suspension will remain in one supervised room or area for the entire school day and will not be allowed to leave the room or area without supervision. Upon arrival (8:45 AM) the student will report to the Main Office. The student will continue with assigned work and will eat lunch in the room or designated area until dismissal (3:20 PM). Students are also prohibited from attending any school or district sponsored events that may occur during this time, and are prohibited from participating in extracurricular or after-school activities for the duration of the suspension. Every attempt will be made to provide the student with classwork during this time. Students are, however, responsible for making up all classwork, homework, tests and quizzes that were missed during their suspension.

Out of School Suspension (OSS) - A student assigned an external suspension is neither permitted to attend school nor be on school property for the duration of the suspension. Students are also prohibited from attending any school or district sponsored events that may occur during this time, and are prohibited from participating in extracurricular or after-school activities for the duration of the suspension. Every attempt will be made to provide the student with classwork during this time. Students are, however, responsible for making up all classwork, homework, tests and quizzes that were missed during their suspension.

Good Student Standing (Restricted List) - Students on the Restricted List are not permitted to attend any extracurricular event or activity. "Extracurricular" is defined in this instance as any activity or event not essential to the student's progress toward mastery of the report card standards in a given Trimester in Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies. This includes, but is not limited to: building wide parties, concerts, dances, clubs, sports, etc. Exceptions to any activity will only be at administrative discretion. Note: Exclusion from major events is not part of general restriction, and will be determined on a case-by-case basis. Major events are defined as: School socials, all school trips, Celebration Day, and Moving Up Ceremony. Restriction will be determined by the administration and will be dependent on the severity of the behavior infraction, student's number of prior infractions, and how close the behavior infraction occurs to the event in question.

Walter Hill Student Code of Conduct Discipline Matrix:

When a student's behavior requires disciplinary action the Code of Conduct Discipline Matrix below will be utilized. A Code of Conduct Matrix will be applied consistently across all schools and with all students, unless otherwise precluded in a student's Behavioral Intervention Plan.

The Code of Conduct Discipline Matrix utilizes progressive strategies, approaches, counseling, and administrative responses to increase student success. Progressive discipline is the process of using increasingly more progressive steps when a student fails to correct a problem after being given a reasonable opportunity to do so.

The premise behind progressive discipline is to first use the least severe action necessary to correct an unacceptable behavior. Ultimately, the goal is to help the student understand their role in improving an unacceptable behavior and if the unacceptable behavior continues, further consequences will be employed. Progressive Discipline can go hand in hand with Restorative Practice which is outlined following the matrix.

Administration reserves the right to make the final decision in the context of each student's infraction when assigning consequences within the matrix, and may reduce or exceed the chart's recommended level of consequences. These decisions are based on the severity and circumstances of the infraction. In these instances, common sense will prevail.

Restorative Practice: Discipline will be defined as a deliberate, proactive process that supports the development of positive social behavior vital to the success of its students. The Principals must use informed decision making when determining if a student's actions will result in administrative actions. Administrative Action(s) can either be of the traditional disciplinary consequences which are listed in the matrix within the Code of Conduct or the restorative discipline. The goal is to modify the unacceptable behavior. The goal is not to punish the student but to more strongly alert the student of the need to correct the problem and to provide support to encourage changed behavior.

Restorative Practice promotes inclusiveness, relationship-building, and problem-solving through such restorative methods as circles for teaching and conflict resolution that bring victims, offenders, and their supporters together to address the issue and/or wrongdoing. The underlying premise of Restorative Discipline rests with the belief that people will make positive changes when those in positions of authority do things with them rather than to them. Students will be taught to understand the weight of their actions and the impact it has on others rather than just receiving a consequence.

Restorative Practice is not a system to dismiss punitive consequences - detention, in-school suspensions, out-of-school suspensions, etc. Rather, this system is used as a chance to reduce the number of punitive consequences. The ultimate goal of restorative practice is to work with students to develop positive relationships and reduce negative interactions.

Through various approaches, such as restorative circles, we will follow the 5 'R's of Restorative Practice:

Relationship Respect Responsibility Repair Reintegration

There are Six Key Questions to Restorative Practice:

- 1. What happened?
- 2. What were you thinking of at the time?
- 3. What have you thought about since?
- 4. Who has been affected by what you have done?
- 5. In what way have they been affected?
- 6. What do you think you need to do to make things right?"

*Bus infractions may result in an indefinite suspension from the bus.

Administration reserves the right to make the final decision in the context of each student's infraction when assigning consequences within the matrix, and may reduce or exceed the chart's recommended level of consequences. These decisions are based on the severity and circumstances of the infraction. In these instances, common sense will prevail.

Additional Information For Students With Disabilities:

In rare instances, a student may need to be placed in a therapeutic hold to ensure their safety and/or the safety of others. During a therapeutic hold, the district assures physical restraint and seclusion techniques used on students with disabilities are only used in an emergency in which the student is exhibiting behavior that places the student or others in immediate physical danger in accordance with the provisions at N.J.S.A. 18A:46-13.4 et seq.
