Pick-Up of Child by a Person Other Than Those Listed on Veracross

We understand that at times you may need to arrange pick-up of your child by someone whose name is not listed as a contact in Veracross. As much as possible, please add these individuals as contacts in the Veracross **Parent Portal** by following these steps:

- 1. Click the **Update Your Information** button under Quick Links.
- 2. Click Contacts for My Children
- 3. You can add a new contact by clicking the blue Add New+ button, or you can update an existing contact as an authorized pickup person by clicking their name card and checking the box under Pickup Authorization.

When a person other than someone listed on the Veracross Parent Portal is picking up your child (e.g., last-minute arrangement for someone else to pick up your child), it is essential that you inform your child's teacher in writing with as much advanced notice as possible.

St. John's Calendar: Now on the Parent Portal

We appreciate your patience while we implement our new Student Information System, Veracross. We are working diligently to get the Calendar synced up with our website. In the meantime, you can access important upcoming dates on the <u>Parent Portal</u>. To view the calendar, simply click the **My Calendar** tab at the top of the Parent Portal homepage.

If you would like to have dates directly imported to your iCalendar or Google Calendar, you can subscribe to the All School Calendar. Scroll down to "Calendar Subscriptions" on the right-hand side of the Parent Portal homepage and click the **All School Calendar** button to manage your subscriptions. Please note that if using Google Calendar, syncing could take up to 24 hours.

If a child can point to blue to express their sadness or red to express their anger, this difficult emotion has become accessible.

Dear Parents,

It is hard to believe that we are nearing the end of September AND at the half-way point of the first trimester. Although it feels as though we have just begun, we are definitely well into the school year.

For families of students in both the Elementary and Middle Divisions, our teachers engage in a Mid-Trimester Report process each trimester. This process is intended to provide feedback to parents regarding the performance and progress of students. While we are still a ways off from the official Report Card and Parent/Teacher Conference period, this snapshot of students is helpful to ensure the success of students.

The Mid-Trimester point for this trimester is Friday, September 27 (tomorrow). Families of students in Middle Division will be able to access these Progress Reports on the **Parent Portal**. For families of students in the Elementary Division, parents will receive an emailed report ONLY if the child's teacher deems it necessary to share information. Not all Elementary Division parents will receive a Mid-Trimester Report; however, all Middle Division parents will have access to a report.

Communication about these reports will be sent out on Friday afternoon.

As always, if you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher. It is always a good practice to maintain lines of communication between the home and school. Furthermore, you are welcome to reach out to us.

Updates to the Elementary Division Program

We are thrilled to announce some significant updates to the Elementary Division Program that went into effect in August of this school year:

- 1. In our **Design, Innovation, and Technology (DIT)** Laboratory under the instruction of Mr. Matthew Morrell students in grades 1-8 are now offered opportunities to engage in a variety of challenges, projects, and initiatives. By expanding the agerange of students who participate in this curricular experience, our Cardinals will develop the aptitudes and dispositions to truly connect with 21st Century technologies. As an example, first grade parents can expect to hear from their child about an upcoming DIT unit: An Exploration of Two-Dimensional Space. Expect to learn about their experiences with analogue coding, polygons, and vector geometry.
- 2. Mr. Jason Roberts is now offering **Band instruction** (brass and woodwind) to students beginning in 4th grade. By adding an additional two years of instrumental music instruction, our band students will be able to perform at even more sophisticated levels. It is exciting to imagine!
- 3. Finally, Ms. Diamond is now providing **Mandarin instruction** to our 4th graders! By exposing students at a younger age to an additional language option, they will be

better informed to make decisions about which language elective to select when they arrive in Middle Division.


Flag-Raising + Cardinal Character Recognition Ceremony: This Monday, September 30 at 8:00 a.m.
