Electronic Device Policy

Redirection/Reassignment

Attendance Grading Policy

- Students who are absent 15 or more times from a class will have their grade reduced by one (1) letter grade.
- The school will make every effort to notify parents of troublesome attendance patterns; however, it is the student's responsibility to maintain satisfactory attendance.
- The fifteen-day absence policy includes excused/unexcused absences.
- Unexcused absences will be subject to the Attendance Policy under Chronic Truancy which may result in no participation for dances, field trips, culmination.

Grading Policy

Final grade in each class is a reflection of performance in these categories

- **<u>Progress/Practice</u>** (classwork, homework, formative assessments)
- <u>Achievement</u> (final projects, tests, writing assessments)

Homework is a key part of your progress in class

Students may have assignments, studying or a long term project that they may need to complete at home

Absences During FINAL EXAMS

Student's must be present in class during the time that final exams are administered.

Students will NOT permitted to take their final exams outside of the allotted Final Exam time provided in the classroom.

If there are extenuating circumstances and a student misses their final they can complete a Final Exam Absence Appeal form and provide documentation that must verify the reason for absence such as but limited to:

- Doctor notes
- Documentation of emergency

*Appeals will NOT be granted for vacation, family trip, family reunions or any other non-emergency activity.


If a student transfers into GHC for the first time in the second semester of 8th grade, the administrator or designee will evaluate student eligibility based on the possible credits attempted and earned from the date of entry into the school.

Participation in Culmination Ceremony and 8th Grade Activities

- Student must clear all obligations including Redirections, Chromebook & textbook return, cafeteria charges, and library charges, if applicable.

Students must have a redirection balance of zero (0) to participate in any school activities

Appeals Process

If a student does not meet the academic criteria for the Certificate of Completion, the student or parent/guardian may appeal by following the procedures listed below.

- A student or parent/guardian must submit a written request to the Culmination Appeals Committee stating why the student did not meet the requirements for the certificate or for participating in the culmination activity. At a minimum, the Culmination Appeals Committee will include a site administrator, a teacher, and a counselor.
- The response of the Culmination Appeals Committee shall be provided in writing and by telephone within three school days following the appeal.
- If the parent/guardian does not agree with the Culmination Appeals Committee they may appeal to the TK-8 Administrative Director within three days.
- A decision by the TK-8 Administrative Director shall be made within three school days following the appeal.



- Argumentative Unit: For the next several weeks of September, we will be reading various articles that revolve around our essential theme: Freedom vs. Security.
