Major Capital Improvement Progress:

- At the new Sussex Central High School building, exterior brickwork is wrapping up while stonework at the main entrance in continuing. Mechanical, electrical and plumbing work is ongoing in the classroom wing. Roofing is substantially complete while sound, lighting and rigging upgrades in the auditorium are 80-percent complete.
- Contractors are working to address the few remaining punch list items at the new Howard T. Ennis School.

- The district is working to provide Special Master Matt Denn with updates and implementation plans addressing district disproportionality in the areas of graduation rate and discipline.
