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5th Grade Social Studies

Historical Perspective

Mount Arlington 5th graders study the events of 9/11 through the perspective of others.

Mrs. Miller-Belmonte's fifth-grade students began the school year analyzing the events of September 11, 2001, by which they learned how first-person accounts and multiple perspectives deepen historical study. Students worked collaboratively in small groups to study interviews with various people, such as first responders, survivors, family members, and government officials. They reported their findings to the class, sharing what they learned about the speaker, their challenges on 9/11, and how they responded to the events immediately and over time. To enhance the importance of historical perspective and knowledge of September 11th, the fifth graders worked on a culminating project in which they interviewed a family member to hear their historical narrative.
