## Noticing the Good

Our third graders are new to the Columbus library and are learning how to choose "just right" books, or ones that are a good fit length, difficulty, and subject. Class discussions start with reminiscing about the books they loved at Hawthorne (American Girl Doll books, Piggy and Elephant, The Pigeon, and The Crayon). Library media **Specialist Kristin Finno let the students** know that it's ok to go back to those favorites, but at Columbus they now have access to new books - chapter books. They also learned about reading stamina, or reading longer to get better. In case you want to read along with our third graders, Ms. Finno recommends you pick up Magic Treehouse, My Weird School, Junie B. Jones, Bad Kitty, The Bad Guys, Humphrey, Who Is or Who Was books, Press Start!, Diary of a Pug, and Eerie Elementary.

Ms. Finno is also reinforcing "just right library behavior" with a pom-pom competition. Classes earn pom-poms for a series of appropriate behaviors including using library voices and volume, staying on task, and cleaning up after class. For those keeping score, Mrs. Ponte's class is currently
