Teacher's Corner: Mathematics

Mrs Ferrari - Algebra 1 & Geometry

Algebra 1 and Geometry students have been productive in completing their assignments on the fundamentals of Mathematics. Lessons and worksheets have been prepared from the abundant materials I have acquired through the years. The students in the classes are engaged and are provided with immediate feedback on what they know. The class is also creating a pamphlet about the fundamentals of mathematics, so that they can use it as a reference as we delve further into the concepts of Algebra 1 and Geometry.









Mrs Fern - Algebra 2 & Probability/Statistics

The beginning of the school year is usually review time in Mrs Fern's classes. Coming back from summer vacation, students were able to get back into the swing of things before diving deeper into Algebra 2 and Prob & Stats. In Algebra 2 students reviewed solving multi step equations in preparation for working with linear equations. Students learned how to write the equation of a line with various pieces of information given (Slope and point, two points) before graphing those linear equations which will lead to graphing



quadratic equations. In Probability and Statistics Students reviewed basic arithmetic skills especially with fractions. From there they learned what an outcome is which lead to finding the probability of events. Students then learned the difference between Theoretical and Experimental Probability before learning compound probability.



In the Classroom

George Mojovich, Physical Education

In the month of September, in Physical Education class, we started discussing the rules and regulations of basketball. When the weather permits, the students go outside to Jerseyland Park, where they practice skills such as layups, free throws and 3 pointers. Students are actively engaged and cooperate well with each other.



Jeremy Kaplan, Social Studies

For US1 and US2 the school year started with students expressing their goals for the class. Students are often asked to do things without speaking on what they want from it. With this "goals" assignment, students are asked to determine what they want from our class. Students then put their goals in a set location for them to regularly check in on to see if they are on pace or if their goals have changed. Once that was determined the US1 students began



breaking down primary source documents about the empires of pre-European America. Students in the US2 class broke down primary sources on the impact and reasons behind the "industrial revolution."

Self Reflection Collages

environment that fosters lifelong learning, mutual respect, creativity, and the joy of learning, with an effective, caring, innovative staff, in partnership with home and the community.






Ms. Schneider Blends 'Zones of Regulation' with Music

Students started the school year infusing SEL into music. Using "The Zones of Regulation", students discussed the various feelings in each zone and completed playlists for each zone, including one song to return to the calmer "green zone". Throughout the year during our daily music appreciation time, students will hear a randomly selected song from a peer's playlist and we will discuss what zone they think it reflects and why they feel that way. Additionally, students have been working on musical rhythms, time signatures, and sight reading rhythms as a foundation for their music theory skills.



Ms. Miller's Social Studies classes are off to a great start!

Social Studies students spent time learning classroom routines and expectations before diving into course specific content. Middle School Social Studies started learning about Early Humans and how cave art was used to tell stories. Students created their own cave art paintings depicting "A Day at LMA." World History students have been focusing on geography skills including identifying continents, oceans, and analyzing the importance of different landforms. Students created "Geography Landform Cubes" to hang around the classroom. US I History students have been learning about the early European explorers and the impact they made on Europe and the Americas. US II History students began studying the Industrial Revolution and how the boom in advanced inventions and technology influenced the 20th Century. Economics students have been studying the term Economics and how it impacts their everyday lives.



Updates from Mr. Peter's PE & Health Classes

Students have been working hard In Physical Education to start the year at Lamberts Mill Academy. We began the school year with the Fitness Unit where students participated in multiple fitness activities. Exercises include yoga, pilates, cardiovascular training, strength training, and stretching. Understanding Supported Employment Options Available AFTER Graduation

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT IN NEW JERSEY

Supported Employment helps individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) secure and maintain **competitive employment**, or work in a setting to prepare for competitive employment. An individual's interests, likes, and dislikes are important factors when considering a job or career path.



REQUIREMENTS OF COMPETITIVE EMPLOYMENT

<u>Wages</u>

Individuals are compensated at or above minimum wage, and at a comparable rate to coworkers without IDD performing similar duties with similar experience and education.

Benefits

Individuals receive the same benefits as other employees in a similar position with a similar level of service.

Scheduling

The schedule is determined by the needs of the employer, not the availability of the individual.

<u>Integration</u>

Employment takes place in a setting where individuals with and without disabilities have the opportunity to interact and work alongside each other.

Advancement

The same opportunities for promotion and advancement are available for employees with and without disabilities in similar positions with similar experience.

EXAMPLES OF SERVICES

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)

Federal legislation signed in 2014 to help individuals access education, training, and support services to succeed in the workplace.

KEY TERMS

Competitive Employment

Work performed on a full-time or part-time basis in an integrated setting that is compensated at or above minimum wage.

<u>Division of Vocational</u> <u>Rehabilitation Services</u> (DVRS)

The state agency which provides vocational services for individuals with IDD or other barriers to employment.

"Employment First" State

An initiative that outlines that competitive employment is the preferred post-education activity. It presumes that all individuals, including people with IDD, are capable of integrated employment.

Pre-Employment Transition Services

 Offered to high school students to plan and prepare for entering the workforce.

Job Development

 Assists individuals with a job search, interview skills, and resume development.

Job Sampling

 Gives the individual the opportunity to explore different types of employment and identify areas of interest and ability.

Job Coaching

NJ WORKABILITY

NJ WorkAbility offers people with disabilities who are working, and whose income would otherwise make them ineligible for Medicaid, the opportunity to receive full Medicaid coverage.

Through NJ WorkAbility, individuals can earn up to \$65,196 of gross annual income and maintain less than \$20,000 in assets without threatening their Medicaid status. The Work Readiness Academy serves students ages 18-21 with disabilities and provides a comprehensive employment training experience that incorporates both classroom-based instruction and community-based work-learning experiences. While in the

training classroom, students work cooperatively with similar aged peers to learn critical skills related to employment and socialization. Students also work on career exploration and planning, including the development of a person-centered, post-secondary vision and plan with clear goals and action steps. Program staff remain on-site during the internships to provide and fade support and assistance as needed. Students also participate in field trips focused on career discovery, independent living skills, recreation and independent travel training.










SPECIALS SPOTLIGHT - MS. GRACE - ART

Flu Season is Here!

The period of time when the influenza virus is most contagious is commonly referred to as "flu season" which typically starts in October and peaks between December and February. Getting the flu vaccine is the first step in protecting yourself. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has designated Oct. 5 as the start of flu season and say most people should get vaccinated between mid-September and late October.

NJ law mandates that children 6 months up to 5 years old attending school shall annually receive at least one dose of influenza vaccine between September 1 and December 31 of each year. So, Crossroads will need documentation for students 5 and under indicating that they received the flu vaccine. Please contact your child's physician as soon as possible to schedule an appointment and forward the documentation to the School Nurse.


Ms. Wilson's Class




Mr. Shanfield's Gym Class!








Ms. Sara our OT!
