Budget Report	<p>Susan Willis, Chief Financial Officer, briefed the Board. At the January 22 Board of Education meeting, the Board received an update on the process to develop the 2024-25 Budget. As part of that discussion, the BOE requested administration bring back a recommendation to close between four and seven schools effective Fall 2024.</p> <p>The following buildings were recommended for closure:</p> <p>Hadley Middle School</p> <p>Jardine STEM and Career Explorations Academy</p> <p>Clark Elementary</p> <p>Cleaveland Traditional College and Career Readiness Magnet</p> <p>Park Elementary</p> <p>Payne Elementary</p> <p>Mr. Reeser (Mrs. Bond) moved the Board schedule a public hearing at a Special BOE Meeting on Thursday, February 29, 2024, and direct staff to publish a notice to comply with the requirements of K.S.A. 72-1431c: <i>“School buildings, closing, procedure.”</i> Following the public hearing, the Board will determine at the BOE Regular Meeting on March 4, 2024, whether the school buildings will be closed.</p> <p>The motion passed 7-0.</p> <p>The public notice will be printed as a Legal Publication in <i>The Wichita Eagle</i> on February 14 and 18, 2024.
