



TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
SEPTEMBER 29, 2024

From Fr. Eric: “God is able to bless us wherever we are”. (Numbers 11:26)

Did you ever think that you might have missed God’s blessing? Maybe you were supposed to go on a pilgrimage, but your finances fell through. Or you had hoped to attend a retreat, but someone in your family got sick. Or perhaps you had planned to go to daily Mass at noon, but you got stuck in a work meeting and couldn’t get to church. How frustrating!

In today’s first reading, Medad and Eldad might have felt the same way. Moses had chosen them to be among the seventy elders, and God had promised to place his Spirit upon them. They would be able to hear God’s voice and help Moses care for the Israelites. But they had not gone out to the tent of meeting; they were left back in the camp among the hungry, complaining people. So, it seemed that these two latecomers had missed their chance. But God had other plans. He blessed them anyway—even in the chaos of the camp, even in their confusion. Medad and Eldad proclaimed God’s word right in the midst of the people.

What does this teach us? First, it shows that God is able to bless us wherever we are. He’s not limited by whether we’re in the “right place at the right time.” Second, he’s not limited to working only through certain people. Medad and Eldad had willing hearts open to God’s grace, and that helped them receive his Spirit. Joshua was scandalized and wanted to silence them, but Moses understood: the Lord’s power and his desire to bless his people were far beyond what they had expected. He rejoiced—“Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets!” (Numbers 11:29).

A similar situation is presented in the Gospel Reading. This time, it is about driving out devils in the name of Jesus. For John since the man who cast out demons in the name of Jesus was not one of his close collaborators, he should be prevented from doing so. John might have reasoned that they were commissioned by Jesus so they have the authority to cast out devils in his name. Whoever was not commissioned by Jesus should not be doing what is reserved to commissioned disciples. In effect, the disciples in the Gospel Reading took the same stand as Joshua in the First Reading. While the argument of John sounds valid, it was not up to the disciples to determine who was commissioned to act in the name of Jesus. Only Jesus can determine that since he is the source of power or authority. The reaction of Jesus in the Gospel Reading is very similar to that of Moses. Jesus says that it is not possible for someone to perform a miracle in his name and be against him.

You have not missed your chance to receive God’s blessing! You’re never beyond his reach, and it’s never too late. Today you can seek the Lord. He wants to shower his gifts and heavenly blessings upon you—no matter where you are!

INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC? – Are you curious about the faith? Do you know a relative, friend, or co-worker who is not Catholic and has asked you about your Catholic faith? Encourage them to "Seek the Lord while He may be found; call to Him, while He is still near." The call to conversion and holiness begins with an inquiry and information session – a no obligation, free introductory offer about the Catholic Faith.

The clergy of St. Ann Parish are happy to help individuals inquire about the Catholic Faith, by leading the sessions through the process called: "The ORDER of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly RCIA). It meets over a period of six months, once a week (off for Thanksgiving and Christmas) beginning **Wednesday, October 2nd** in the school in Conference Room A. In these sessions, we will explain the faith and help inquirers every step of the way, guiding them to discern the possibility of entering the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil on April 19, 2025.

All practicing Catholics can be ambassadors by leading someone to the waters of Baptism for full initiation into the Catholic faith or to continuing conversion in order to receive Confirmation and Eucharist.
